her increase to her and her heirs forever but if it should please God that
my Cousin Mary Corby should dye without Lawfull Issue begotten after
body or before she attains to Twenty one Years of Age then I give the
said Negro Girl named Kate to my brother James Corby & his heirs for
ever Then I give my wearing Cloathes to be equally divided between
my Cousin Mary Corby & Mary Hyde Judith Hyde Then I give my
Silver Ribbed Shells one Mourning ring to the Value of Twenty Shillings
Then I give my Cousin Elizabeth Roberts and Mary Bryan each of them
a Mourning ring to the Value of half a pistole each Likewise Mary
Hyde & Judith Hyde each of them a Mourning ring to the Value of
half a pistole each Then I give & bequeath to my Loving Brother
James Corby what Money I have due to me from my Fathers personal
Estate w^{ch} is Lodged in the hands of my Guardian Capt. Robert Goodrich
and my other Guardian Likewise I give to my Brother James Corby all my
right Title & Interest or Claims as may defend to me from my said
Fathers Estate whatsoever and he freely to enjoy & posses peaceably
and quietly he first paying my just debts & funeral Charges and
I do constitute &

and quietly he first paying my just debts & General Charges and
paying the Legacies as I have mentioned Lastly I do constitute &
appoint my said Brother James Esby Esq. to this my last will and
Testament I do hereby revoke all other wills by me heretofore made
