as followeth I then I give my Soul to Almighty God my Creator hoping thro
the Merits of my blest Saviour Jesus Christ to receive a joyful Reception
to Eternal Life and my body to be decently buryed by my Executors hereinafter named

Item I give and bequeath to my Loving Cousin Mary Corby Daughter of Samuel Corby & Mary his wife deceased one Negro Girl by Name Kate & he deceased to her and her heirs for ever but if it should please God that my Cousin Mary Corby should dye without Lawfull Issue begotten of her body or before she attains to Twenty one Years of Age then I give the said Negro Girl named Kate to my brother James Corby & his heirs for ever. Item I give my wearing Cloaths to be equally divided between my Cousin Mary Corby & Mary Hyde Judith Hyde. Item I give my Sister Rebecca Threlkeld one Mourning ring to the Value of Twenty shillings. Item I give my Cousin Elizabeth Roberts and Mary Bryan each of them a Mourning ring to the Value of half a pistole each Likewise Mary Hyde & Judith Hyde each of them a Mourning ring to the Value of half a pistole each. Item I give & bequeath to my Loving Brother James Corby what Money I have due to me from my Fathers personal Estate w^{ch} is Lodged in the hands of my Guardian Capt. Robert Goodrich among other Guardians Likewise I give to my Brother James Corby all my right Title & Interest or Claims as may defend to me from my said Fathers Estate whatsoever and he freely to enjoy & dispose peaceably and quietly he first paying my just debts & funeral Charges and paying the Legacies w^{ch} I have mentioned. Lastly I do constitute & appoint my said Brother James Corby Executor to this my last will and Testament. I do hereby revoke all other wills by me heretofore made Declaring this to be my last will and Testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 18th day of July 1743.
