very Sick and weak in Body but of Perfect Mind and Memory thanks be given
to Almighty God but calling to mind the Mortality of my Body and knowing that
it is appointed for me once to dye do make this my last Will & Testament
that is to say Principally and first of all I give and recommend my Soul into
the hands of God that gave it and for my Body I recommend it to the Earth
to be buried in a Christian like and decent manner at the discretion of my
Executors hereafter mentioned and as touching such worldly Estate wherewith
it hath pleased God to bless me in this life I give devise and dispose of the
same in the following manner and form
Imprimis I give and bequeath to my Son Hudson Allen these Six Negroes as
follows Viz: ^{negro} A Man called Bob A Negro Man called Quash a Negro Boy
called Sawney A Negro Boy called Lewey a Negro Boy called Jimmy a
Negro Girl called Grace with their increase to him and his Assigns Item I
give to my Son Hudson Allen all my right Title and Interest of all and every
part of the Estate which is now in his Possession or on or belonging to the
Plantation on which he now lives.

Item I give to my Son William Allen and his Assigns these Six Negroes as follow
Viz: A Negro Man called Young Ned A Negro Man called Sam a Negro boy
called Dick A Negro boy called Anthony a Negro woman called Mary
a Negro Girl called Little Mary

same in the following manner and form
Imprimis I give and bequeath to my Son Hudson Allen these Six Negroes as follows Viz: A ^{negro} Man called Bob A Negro Man called Wash a Negro Boy called Lawney A Negro Boy called Leroy a Negro Boy called Jimmy a Negro Girl called Grace with their increase to him and his assigns Item I give to my Son Hudson Allen all my right Title and Interest of all and every part of the Estate which is now in his Possession or on or belonging to the Plantation on which he now lives.

Item I give to my Son William Allen and his assigns these Six Negroes as follows Viz: A Negro Man called Young Ned A Negro Man called Sam a Negro boy called Dick A Negro boy called Anthony a Negro Woman called Mary a Negro Girl called little Mary and their increase likewise one Copper Shovel also all the Cattle and Sheep that comes from Haddons Plantation marked with two Crosses and two holes and the Stock of Cattle and Sheep and all other Estate whatsoever Real or Personal which is now in his Possession to him and his heirs.

Item I give to my Daughter Mary Brown these Six Negroes as follows Viz: A Negro Man called Peter which is now in her possession A Negro boy called Phill also in her Possession A Negro boy called Frank A Negro boy called Jack A Negro Woman called Young Judy A Negro Girl called Moll with their Increase to her and her heirs.

21A Item I give to my daughter Ann Chapman and her assigns these six Negroes as follows Vizt. A Negro Man called Toney a Negro boy called Jeffery a Negro boy called Tom a Negro boy called Ben a Negro Woman called Betty a Negro Girl called Lucy with their increase also ten Pounds Sterling Money.

Item I give unto my Granddaughter Mary Carver One Shilling Sterling.

Item I give unto my Granddaughter Ann Chapman a Young Grey Mare branded with a single A with my Saddle and furniture also my Will and desire is that my two Negroes Old Jimmy and Old Judy may live with which they please of my four Children.

Item after all the above Legacies and bequests and my Just Debts and funeral Expences are paid and deducted from my Estate I give

and bequeath to my four Children Vizt. Hudson Allen William Allen

Mary Brown and Ann Chapman all the rest and residue of my Estate both real and Personal to be equally divided amongst them.

Also that my Son Hudson Allen and my Son William Allen do Appraise my said Estate so as to make an equal distribution thereof and further my Will and desire is there may be no other Appraisement upon my said Estate Lastly I do hereby Appoint my Son Hudson Allen and my Son William Allen my only Executors of this my last Will and Testament.

William Allen my only Executors of this my last Will and Testament
and I do hereby revoke and disannul all other former Will or Wills by me
in any way before this made Ratifying and Confirming this and no
other to be my last Will and Testament In Witness whereof I have
hereunto set my hand and Seal the day and Year above Written
