In the Name of God Amen I Ann James of the County of York Virginia being very Sick and Weak in Body but of perfect Mind and Memory thanks be to God do Ordain this my last Will & Testament that is to say after all my just Debts are paid I give bequeath & dispose of my worldly Estate in manner and form following

Imprimis my Will and desire is that all my wearing Apparel may be equally divided between my lawful Daughter Elizabeth Hopkins and my Niece Lucretia Davis

Item I Give unto the said Lucretia Davis Ten Pounds to be paid on Account of her Passage to London as soon as an Opportunity offers agreeable to the Executors

Item I Give and bequeath unto Elizabeth Hopkins and Lucretia Davis the produce of all my Estate real and Personal the said Goods and my late Husband's wearing Apparel to be disposed of by the Executors at Public Sale and to be equally divided between the said Elizabeth and Lucretia

Item in case the said Elizabeth Hopkins is dead I do hereby appoint Lucretia Davis my sole Heir

Item I appoint the said Executors to apply to Frances Ann Wright of Southwark London to call her to an Account and to receive what Sum or Sums may be due to the Estate of my former husband John Heath decd. the said Frances Ann Wright having a Power of Attorney by virtue of which the said Frances was to have the one half recovered and the other half I give and bequeath to Lucretia Davis I also appoint Doct: George

The said Frances Ann Wright having a Power of Attorney by virtue of
which the said Frances was to have the one half recovered and the other
half I give and bequeath to Lucretia Davis I also appoint Doct: George
Riddell and Ephraim Goosley of York Town and Joseph Davenport of
Williamsburgh Executors to this my last Will and Testament in witness
my hand and Seal this 25th day of October 1748.
