being at present in a very low state of health do make and ordain this to be my
last Will and Testament being in my perfect Sences It is my Will & desire
that after my Just Debts and Funeral Expences are paid that the remaining
part of what I shall die possessed of be transmitted to my Brother Robert
Green Merchant in London And it is likewise my desire that Mr. John
Gibbons and Doct. James Tyre will take on themselves to execute this my
Will And so hereby revoke all former Wills by me heretofore made declaring
this to be my last Will and Testament this day of August 1755.

At a Court held for York County the 15th day of September 1755.

This Will was proved by the Oaths of Robert Ballard & Jacob Wray then

with Robert Ballard his Security entered into and acknowledged Bond as
the Law directs Certificate was granted him for obtaining a Probate in
