and former Wills whatsoever. First my desire and Will is that my loving Wife Sarah
Rhodes may have the Use of my whole Estate Real and Personal during her Widowhood
and in Case she Marries my Desire and Will is that the whole Estate be equally
divided amongst my Wife and Children that are Living Further my desire is that if my
now Wife Sarah Rhodes should Marry and her Husband can give sufficient Security
for my Childrens part of my Estate that she may enjoy the same until my Children shall
arrive at Lawful Age Further my Will and desire is that after the decease of my
loving Wife that my Son Francis Rhodes may have my Lands with all the own
Appurtenances thereunto belonging to him and his Heirs and Assigns and in Case my
Son Francis Rhodes dies under Age my Will is that my Land be sold and the Money

equally divided amongst my Daughters and further my Will is that in case my Children should die without Issue that my Estate may be equally divided - and the one half to be divided between John Rhodes and Elizabeth Rhodes Son & Daughter of Francis Rhodes during their Lives and after their decease for the Estate to, return to Clifton Rhodes and his Brother Sons of John Rhodes in Hanover County and the other half of my Estate in case of my Childrens death my desire is that the afo^d Clifton Rhodes and his Brother shall have and enjoy they and their Heirs forever In Witness whereof I have set my hand and Affixed my Seal this second Day of April One thousand seven hundred and forty five My Will & desire is that during my Wifes Widowhood there be no security given no Inventory of no Appraisement taken or demanded I do Appoint my loving Wife Sarah Rhodes John Glasp and Fleming Bates my Ex^{rs} of this my Last Will.
