 of Charles parish in York County being sick & weak in body but of perfect
 Mind Sense & Memory Do make this my last will and Testament in
 manner & form following that is to say First I bequeath my soul into
 the hands of Almighty God who gave it and trusting through the merits
 and death of my dear Redeemer Jesus Christ to find salvation for my soul
 And for what worldly Estate God hath been pleased to bless me with
 I give in manner as follows I order my just debts and funeral Expences
 to be paid and the remaining part of my Estate I give & bequeath
 as follows I give unto my wellbeloved wife Mary Chisman
 my Negro's Sarah Nimmo and my Negro boy Tom to her and to the
 heirs of her body forever also with the Increase of them to her and
 her heirs for ever Item I give unto my wellbeloved Daughter
 Mildred Chisman my Negro's Esther Ben. Frank and my Negro boy
 Peter with the Increase of them to her and the heirs of her body
 lawfully begotten forever if in case my said Daughter should dye before
 she comes to the age of Twenty one Years or Married then my will is
 that my wellbeloved wife Mary Chisman shall have my Negro's Esther wth
 her Increase to her and the heirs of her body lawfully begotten for and
 my Negro boy Frank I give unto my sister Elizabeth Chisman to her
 and her heirs forever and my Negro boy Ben. I give unto my Godson
 10th Patrick the son of John Patrick to him and his heirs forever
 and my Negro boy Peter I give unto my Godson John Chisman son of
 my Brother Edmund Chisman by Elizabeth his wife to him & his
 heirs for ever the remaining part of my Estate I give unto my well
 beloved wife who I appoint whole & sole executrix of this my last will
 and Testament revoking and disallowing of all other wills heretofore
 made by me In Witness whereof I have unto set my hand and affix my
 Seal the Day & Year within written

The Court held for York County March the 15th 1751
 This last Will & Testament of George Chisman du^{ce} was this day presented in
 Court by the Executors therein appointed who made oath to it and being
 proved by the oath of John Hayward and John Patrick two of them

In Obedience to an order of Court dated the 16th day of Nov. 1741
We the Subscribers did with the Surveyor run the dividing Line
between Peter Goodwin and James Galthorpe according to the will
of James Galthorpe dec^d. Viz^t. Beginning at a Gum standing on
the head of Cherry Gut then running a straight Line bearing South
Seventeen Degrees thirty Minutes West to the head of Bakers branch

The Deposition of John Bains saith that his father Matthias Bains
had several times told him that the Gut opposite to the ware house -
was known by the name of Dunning's field whereon Mr. Goodwin's
house stands was called Bakers field and further he saith not

The Deposition of M^r. John Chapman saith that James
Galthorpe told him that the branch is proved to be Bakers branch
was during his residence in the Neck field and seemed to be the dividing
branch between the two Brothers James and Elshange Galthorpe and
further he saith not.

The Deposition of Henry Freeman saith that he was several
times informed by Benjamin Shepard who lived on the Land in dispute
that the branch w^{ch} we run the Line was called by the name of
Bakers branch and that the said Shepard had often told him that
from Bakers branch to the head of Cherry Gut was the dividing
Line and further he saith not. Taken before us Dec^r. 1741
