and form as followeth. First I recommend my Soul into the hands of

upon me I give and bequeath as followeth.

Item I Give and bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth Hewitt a Negro
Woman Frank.

Item I Give and bequeath to my Son John Jarvis a Negro boy Charles

Item I Give and bequeath to my Daughter Mary Jarvis a Negro boy Bristol.

Item I Give to my loving Wife Mary Jarvis until my Younger Children
arrive to the Age of Twenty one the residue of my Estate and then to be
equally divided as my Children comes to the Age above mentioned

amongst my Wife and her Children but if in case my Wife should
marry then to be directly divided as the Law directs amongst my
Wife and her Children.

Item my Will and desire is that my Wife who I appoint my Executrix
to be my sole and lawful

I Give and bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth Hewitt a Negro Woman Frank.

I Give and bequeath to my Son John Jarvis a Negro boy Charles

I Give and bequeath to my Daughter Mary Jarvis a Negro boy Bristol.

I Give and bequeath to my loving Wife Mary Jarvis until my Younger Children arrive to the Age of twenty one the residue of my Estate and then to be equally divided as my Children comes to the Age above mentioned

amongst my Wife and her Children but if in case my Wife should marry then to be divided as the Law directs amongst my Wife and her Children

I Give and bequeath that my Wife who I appoint my Executrix to by my last Will and Testament do pay my Debts and that my said Wife may have the Liberty of Selling a Negro Woman named Hannah provided she lay out the Money she sells for in a young Negro to the Value of twenty five Pounds to be divided as above mentioned amongst my Wife and her Children and if the said Negro sells for more than twenty five Pounds that the remainder of the Money be to help pay my Debts.

 Witnesses thereto Sworn to by Mary Jarvis the Executrix therein named and
 Ordered to be recorded And on the Motion of the said Executrix who together
 with Robert Shute Jun^r and William Fargason her Securities entered into and
 Acknowledged Bond as the Law directs Certificate was granted her for obtaining
 a Probate in due form.
