all my Tract of Land I now live on to him and his Heirs and —

Affine forever his paying to the rest of my Legatee hereafter mentioned the just Sum of fifty Pounds Current Money to be paid at the expiration of three Years

Item I give and bequeath unto my loving Brother Richard & Brother Graves five head of Cattle his choice of my stock to him and his Heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my God Child Mary Graves my Negro Boy Jack to her and her Heirs forever.

Item I give to John Watts all my wearing Cloaths

Item my Will and desire is that my Exors hereafter mentioned shall sell my two Negroes Sampson & Joam and all the residue of my Estate and that it may be equally divided amongst my Brother Richard Graves Richard Groser Graves & Elizabeth Stone.

Lastly I Do Constitute and Appoint my Brothers William Graves Richard Graves & Richard Groser Graves my Executors and I do hereby make void all other Wills and this to be my last Will and Testament In Witnes whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affix my Seal this Sixteenth day of May Anno Domini
