 in the County of York Master being very sick and Weak but of sound and perfect
 Mind and Memory do make this my Last Will and Testament in manner of form -
 following that is to say first and principally I commend my Soul to the hands of God
 that gave it my Body I desire may be buried in a decent Christian manner and as
 touching such Temporal Estates wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me with I Give
 and dispose thereof as followeth I Impreser I will and desire that all my Just Debts -
 and funeral Expences be discharged and satisfied Item I Give unto my Cousin William
 Brown all my wearing Apparel. Item I Give unto my Uncle William Allen my
 young bay Horse Saddle and Bridle. Item I Give unto my Cousin Ann Brown
 my Grey Horse called Boots and a side Saddle with its furniture and Bridle
 Item I Give unto my Sister Mary Carver and to her Heirs all the Residue of my
 Estate provided her Husband Alexander Carver when therunto required give unto
 my Uncle William Allen such assurance by Bond as the the said William Allen shall
 require that he the said Carver in case my Sister Mary Carver should dye without
 Issue will pay the said Residue of my Estate as follows Viz: Thirty Pounds thereof
 to my Cousin William Brown and the rest to my Cousin Hudson Brown and if

that said Alexander Carver shall refuse to give such Bond then I give thirty Pounds
of the said Residue of my Estate to my Cousin William Brown and the rest to my
Cousin Hudson Brown and his Heirs forever Lastly I do appoint by Uncle William
Allen and my brother in law Alexander Carver Executors of this my last Will &
Testament In Testimony whereof I the said Hudson Haddon have hereunto set my
hand and affixed my Seal the twenty eighth Day of December in the Year of our Lord 1745.

At a Court held for York County the 17th Day of February 1745.

This Will was presented in Court by Alexander Carver one of the Ex^{rs} and was proved
by the Oaths of Hudson Allen & Samuel Brown the Witnesses thereto and Order'd to be
Recorded and on the motion of the said Ex^r who made Oath according to Law Certificate
was granted him for obtaining a Probate thereof in due form Giving Security Whereupon
he together with Hudson Allen and John Jones his Securities entered into and Acknowledg'd
Bonds And William Allen the other Executor personally appeared in Court and refused
the Executorship.
