Barton Parish in York County being very weak in Body but of perfect Sense
and Memory God be praised for the same I do make Constitute and Appoint this to
be my last Will and Testament revoking and disannulling all former Wills whatsoever
First my Will and desire is that my Household Goods of all sorts my Cattle Hogg and
what I called Great I have may be Sold the Buyers giving Security with Bond as a
usual they having twelve Months Credit. Secondly I Give and bequeath to my
Loving Sister Sarah Baskerville my Land and a Negro Woman Gift and all the
Money that my Goods and Chattels are Sold for after my just Debts and Funeral
Charges are paid to her and the Heirs of her Body lawfully begotten But if my
Sister Sarah Baskerville should die without lawful Issue of her Body my Will is
that George Baskerville Son of John Baskerville shall have and enjoy the foreaid
Estate further my Will is that the Plantation be rented out and the income
thereof to be paid unto my Sister aforesaid. Further my Will is that my Sister

and all the Debts that are now due to me I likewise give unto my
Sister Sarah Baskerville my Riding Horse I do Appoint Sarah
Baskerville Pinkethman Eaton and Fleming Bates Executors of this
my last Will In Witness whereof I have set my hand and affixed
my Seal this 31st Day of December 1747.

At a Court held for York County, the 21st day of March 1747.
This Will was proved by the Oaths of William Higgins & Henry Watts
Witnesses thereto and Ordered to be Recorded. And on the Motion of
Sarah Baskerville Executor who made Oath and Fleming Bates Ex^r
(a Quaker) who made his Solemn affirmation according to Law
Certificate was granted them for obtaining a Probat thereof in due form
giving Security On which they together with Matthew Shields and
William Stanup their Securities entered into and Acknowledged Bonds
for the said Executors their due Admin of the Estate of the said
Decedent and performance of his Will
