In the Name of God Amen I James Calthorp of the Parish of Charles in the County of York being Sick & weak of body but of Sound & perfect Sense & Memory Thanks be to Almighty God for the same do make & Ordain this my last Will & Testament in manner and form following viz^t First I recommend my Soul to the M^{er}cy of Almighty God who gave it hoping through the M^{er}its of my blessed Saviour & Redeemer Jesus Christ to receive perfect Remission and forgiveness of all my Transgressions & Offences and my body to the Earth to receive a decent Burial at the discretion of my Executors hereafter expressed And as to what Temporal Estate which the Lord of his great Bounty hath been pleased to bestow upon me I give & bequeath as followeth. First I will that all my debts be duly paid and discharged Item I give unto my loving Brother John Calthorp two Negro's namely Billy & Rachel to him & his heirs forever Item I give & bequeath unto my loving Brother Charles Calthorp four Negro's namely Tom, Judith, Frank & Sam to him & his heirs forever also three pounds w^{ch} he hath in his own hands My will & desire is that the residue of my Estate (my Land excepted) be equally divided between my two Brothers Charles Calthorp & John Calthorp And I do Nominate constitute & appoint my loving Brother Charles Calthorp whole & sole Executor of this my last Will & Testament So Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand & affixed my Seal this 20th day of October 1744.
