hold Goods wearing apparel and every thing I now am possessed of
immediatly to enjoy after my decease and I do hereby revoke all
of Wills if any made either by Instrument or word of Mouth
and do constitute him to be my whole and lawfull executor as Witness
my hand this second day of October Anno Domini 1739

presents Sealed with our Seals dated this 16th day of March 1740.
The Condition of this obligation is such That if the above bound
Dunn Executor of the last will and Testament of James Eggington dec^d do
make or cause to be made a true & perfect Inventory of all and singular the
Goods Chattels & Credits of the s^d Decedent what have or shall come
the hand possession or knowledge of the s^d w^m Dunn or into the hand
possession of any other person or persons for him and the same so made
exhibit into the County Court of York at such time as he shall be therein

Required by the said Court and the same Goods Chattels & Credits and all other the Goods Chattels & Credits of the said deceased w^{ch} at any time after do shall come to the hands possession or knowledge of the said w^{ch} I am or into the hands and possession of any other person or persons for him so well and truly administer according to Law and Justice do make a true and just account of his Actings and doings therein when thereto required by the said Court and also shall well and truly pay and deliver all the Legacies confirmed and Specified in the said Testament as far as the said Goods Chattels and Credits will thereunto extend and the Law shall charge then this is obligation to be void and of none effect unless to remain in full force and virtue.
