and that shall be due unto my loving Mother Anne Spurr during
her natural life with all and every my Estate in the manner aforesaid
as to the Personal. Item it is my Will that after my said Mothers
decease my Sister Mary Spurr have hold and enjoy the aforesaid -

Demised Premises in manner and form aforesaid and to her Heirs forever
But my will is that if my said Sister Mary Spurr die without Issue of her
Body lawfully begotten that then the aforesaid and abovementioned
Premises do descend to and be vested in John Powers the Son of John
Powers of Charles Parish in York County now dec'd to him and his Heirs
forever And for performance of this my last will I constitute and
Appoint my father in Law Samuel Spurr and my loving mother
Anne Spurr Executors of this my last will and Testament.
