Ordered that William Thompson be Sumoned to appear at the next Court to answer a Complaint against him for misusing Sarah Wood an Orphan under his care and that he bring the said Sarah with him.

This Day came the Parties by their Attornies and the said Def^t saith That he cannot Gainsay the Plaintiffs Action Therefore with the Plt Assent It is considered by the Court that he recover against the Defend^t Two thousand and fifty three Pounds ten Shillings and six Pence half penny the Debt in the Declaration mentioned and his Costs by him in this behalf expended To be Levied of the Goods and Chattels of the Decedent when sufficient thereof shall come to the hands of the said Defend^t to be Administred.

But this Judgment is to be discharged by the Payment of five hundred eighty nine Pounds sixteen Shillings and three Pence three farthings together with Interest for the same to be Computed after the rate of five per Centum per Annum from the fourth day of November 1765 to the time of Payment and the Costs.
