my last Will and Testament in manner and form following on the 15<sup>th</sup> day of May 1745

Item I Give and bequeath unto M<sup>r</sup> Elizabeth Howard all my Cash and my  
Bed and furniture.

Item my Will is that all the rest of my Estate be divided between M<sup>r</sup> Elizabeth  
Howard, Mary Sweeney, Elizabeth Howard Daughter of Francis Howard, Elizabeth  
Howard Daughter of John Howard and Elizabeth Mingham.

Item my will is that M<sup>r</sup> Elizabeth Howard give a dozen pair Gloves to my friends.

Item my will is that my Ex<sup>x</sup> shall give no Security and that my Estate shall not  
be Appraised. I do appoint M<sup>r</sup> Elizabeth Howard to be my Ex<sup>x</sup> of this my  
last Will and Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and  
Seal.

At a Court held for York County the 16<sup>th</sup> Day of September 1745.

This Will was presented in Court by Elizabeth Howard the Executrix therein -  
Named and was proved by the Oath of Francis Howard Gent one of the Witnesses  
and Ordered to be Recorded. And on the Motion of the said Executrix who made -  
Oath according to Law Certificate was granted her for obtaining a Probat thereof  
Ex<sup>x</sup> in due form

In the Name of God Amen I John Ballard of York Town in -  
the County of York Merch<sup>t</sup> being in good health at present But not knowing -  
when it may please God to take me out of this World Therefore for avoiding a  
Contention after my death I do make this my last Will and Testament.

Imprimis my desire is that all my just Debts and funeral Expences be  
first paid and then I lend unto my beloved wife Elizabeth Ballard during her -  
Widowhood for the better enabling her to maintain and bring up my Children the -  
following Six Slaves Namely Mirr<sup>i</sup>, Frank, Old Will, George, Jenny, and Mary.  
but in case of her Marriage or death then I Give the said Six Slaves with their  
Increase to my Son Thomas Ballard and to his Heirs. I likewise lend unto my said  
wife during her Widowhood all my Household furniture and Kitchen furnitures  
that

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That shall be in Use at the time of my death also my Chaise Harness and Horses  
and Cart and Horses but in case she Marrieth again or at her death Then I Give  
all those things to my Son Thomas and to his Heirs And if my said Wife Marry  
or dies before my Son Thomas arrives to the Age of twenty one Years then I desire  
Kitchen furniture that all the Household furniture, Chaise Harness, Horses of Cart and Horses be Sold at  
Publick Auction upon twelve Monthes Credit and the Produce therof I Give unto  
my Son Thomas and if he dies before he comes to the Age of twenty one Year then  
I desire that the Produce thereof be equally divided amongst all my surviving Children  
I likewise desire that the Rent of those two Lots and Houses of mine wherein Mr.  
Henry Walters and Susanna Thompson now live may be paid to my said Wife until  
my Sons to whom they shall be given come of Age / for the better enabling her to +  
maintain and bring up my Children as aforesaid.

Item I Give unto my Son Thomas Ballard and to his Heirs their Lot or half  
Acre of Land wherein I now live described in the Plan of the Town by the  
Figures 54. together with all the Houses and Appurtenances thereto belonging  
and also an Acre of Ground which I bought of Mr. Gwyn Reade lying on the  
South West side of two Town Lots wherein Capt. William Rogers lately dwelt  
also my Plantation near York Town called Rich Neck joining to the Land  
of Edward Baptist also my Warehouse at the Water Side also two young Negro  
Men named Giles & Jerry and also my Gun, Pistols, Sword and Watch.

Item I Give unto my Son John Ballard and to his Heirs one half Acre of  
Land which I bought of Mr. Gwyn Reade and wherein Henry Walters now  
lives joining to the South West side of a Town Lot belonging to Cole Digges Esq<sup>r</sup>  
together with the Houses and Appurtenances thereto belonging and also a Negro  
boy named William, Son of Negro Madge.

Item I Give unto my Son Robert Ballard and to his Heirs one half Acre of  
Land which I bought of Mr. Gwyn Reade joining to the half Acre of Land before  
given to my Son John and joining to a Town Lot of Richard Rimbler Esq<sup>r</sup> and  
whereon Susanna Thompson now lives together with the Houses and Appurtenances  
thereon and also a Negro Boy named Ben.

Item I Give unto my Son William Ballard and to his Heirs one Acres of  
Land which I bought of Mr. Gwyn Reade lying and joining to two Town Lots as  
described in the Plan of the Town by the Figures 67 of 71. and also a Negro boy  
Named Michael and a Negro Girl Named Mary.

Item It is my Will and desire that if it shall Please God that either of my Sons John or Robert should dye before they come to the Age of twenty one Years that the Land with the Houses and Appurtenances given and devised to him dying shall descend and go to my Son William Ballard and to his Heirs and if both my said Sons John and Robert should dye before they come to twenty one Years of Age that then my Son William shall have his choice of the Lands and Houses with the Appurtenances given and devised to them and my Son Thomas Ballard to have the other to him and his Heirs.

Item I Give unto my Daughter Catherine Ballard and to her Heirs one Young Negro Woman named Phillis and her Child Lucy and a Negro Girl named Hannah Daughter of Negro Mary and twenty Pounds Current Money to buy her a peice of Plate.

Item I Give unto my Daughter Elizabeth Ballard and to her Heirs one Negro Woman Named Rose and one Negro Girl named Moll and twenty Pounds Current Money to buy her a peice of Plate.

Item I Give to my Daughter Ann Ballard and to her Heirs one Negro Girl Named Hannah and a Negro Girl Named Grace.

Item I Give unto Miss Mary Gibbons the Sum of ten Pounds to be paid her a Year after my death.

Item It is my Will and desire that all the remainder of my Estates of what kind soever which I have not already particularly given and bequeathed away and all the Goods which may come into me after my death be sold upon twelve Month's Credit the buyer or giving good security but it is my desire that the Goods which may come into me after my death --- be sold entire without being broke and the produce of the whole together with what Cash I may have by me and all Outstanding Debts when received be equally divided between my said Loving Wife Elizabeth Ballard and my four Sons Thomas, John, Robert and William and my three Daughters Catherine, Elizabeth and Anne.

Item It is my Will and desire that my Son Thomas Ballard be bound to Messrs Thomas and William Nelson or to Thomas Nelson Jun<sup>r</sup> Esq<sup>t</sup> until he comes to the Age of Twenty one Years and that my Son John Ballard be bound when he comes to the Age of sixteen Years to the Sea if he shall approve of that if not then to some other calling as my Executors shall think proper till comes to the Age of twenty one Years and that my other two Sons Robert and William be bound to some Trade or calling as my Executors shall think proper when they arrives to sixteen Years of Age and to serve till they arrive at the Age of twenty one and that my Sons live with their Mother till

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bound out and my Daughters hit Marriages or hit they respectively arrives to Lawful Age.

Item It is my desire that as the Money arising upon the Sale of the Goods Ordered to be sold and all other Money as fast as it shall be received be paid to Mr. William Nelson Jun<sup>r</sup>: whom I desire to put the same out to Interest taking two good Securities for each sum so by him put out And the Principal and Interest to be paid to my children when they shall be respectively capable to demand it. And Lastly I do appoint my said Loving Wife Elizabeth Ballard, May<sup>r</sup>: John Buckner M<sup>r</sup>: Matthew Hubbard & M<sup>r</sup>: Edmund Smith and M<sup>r</sup>: Samuel Reade Executors of this my last Will and Testament to whom I give each a Gold Ring of a Guinea Piece to be bought in England hereby revoking all other Wills and Testaments by me before in any manner made In Witness whereof I hereunto set my hand and Seal this 24<sup>th</sup> day of December 1744.
