deposeth that being at the House of the late John Burcher decd? about three
or four days after the death of the said Burcher William Admiston Rogers put
into his Deponents hand an Instrument of Writing which he said was the
poor old Mans Will meaning the deceased John Burcher which this Deponent
read and was to the purport following after the Preamble he gave to his
Widow Elizabeth Burcher all his Estate and after her decease directed the
same to be equally divided among his Children and further directed that
there should be no Appraisment of his Estate nor any security given by his
Widow for the same and also appointed his said Wife sole Executrix by the
said Will and this Deponent verily believes the signing of the said Will to
be hand writing of the said John Burcher decd? and that Walter Chapman
and William Admiston Rogers were Evidences to the said Will and
