 uncertain our Transitory Life is here Do in my perfect Mind Sense and
 Memory constitute make & appoint this to be my last Will & Testament
 revoking & disannulling of any other Will or Wills heretofore made by me
 First I bequeath my Soul into the hands of Almighty God who gave it
 and trusting thro' the Merits of my Saviour Jesus Christ his Death and
 Passion to find Salvation for the same And my Body I recommend to the earth
 to be decently bury'd by my wellbelov'd wife Damaris Buttenworth who
 I appoint whole & sole executrix of this my last will & Testament And as
 to what worldly Estate it hath pleased God to bless me with I after
 that my funeral Expences & just Debts are paid I give & bequeath
 in Manner & form following. I give & give to my Daughter Mary
 Gibbon & the wife of John Gibbon one Negro woman Slave named
 Grace and all her future Increase to her & to the heirs of her Body
 lawfully begotten for ever I give unto my Grand Daughter Elizabeth
 Gibbon & her Daughter of the said John & Mary Gibbons one Negro
 Girl named Hagar with all her future Increase to her & to the heirs of
 her Body lawfully begotten for ever and if my said Grand Daughter should dye
 before she comes to Age or Marry'd or without such lawfull Issue then I give
 the said Negro with her Increase to my Grand Daughter Damaris Gibbons
 to her & her heirs for ever I give unto my said Grand Daughter
 Damaris Gibbon one Negro Girl named Violet with all her future
 Increase to her & to the heirs of her Body lawfully begotten for ever and if
 she my said Grand Daughter should dye without such lawfull Issue
 before she come of Age or Marry'd then I give the said Negro Violet with
 all her future Increase to my Daughter Mary Gibbon afores^d and her
 heirs for ever I give unto my Son in Law Thomas Brewer one
 Little of Land which I now have in the Town of Denton in the Province
 of North Carolina to him & his heirs for ever I give unto my wellbelov'd
 wife Damaris Buttenworth the Legacies before given are excepted all the
 rest my Estate for her support & Maintenance during her Natural Life

Provided she doth not again marry If she does, my will & desire is that my Daughter Mary Gibbons shall have the one half of my Estate immediately paid to her for the use of her & her heirs and my desire is that my said wife may in no wife be accountable to the Court for my Estate or give any security for the same so long as she remain & unmarried. In Witness whereof I hereunto set my hand and fix my seal this fifteenth day of May in the Year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred forty & two.
