Mind and Memory do make and Ordain This my Last Will and Testament in
manner and form following.

Item I give and bequeath all my Land in York County to my Son
William Handford and his Heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath to Matthew Hubbard One hundred acres of Land
more or less being part of the Land I bought of Robert and Litter Hubbard
in Warwick County and bounding as following Beginning at Hewitts
Corner Pond Then Northwardly to the Briery Swamp Thence South East
up the said Swamp or Branch to Warwick Road by the Coley Pond Thence
North West along the said Road to York Road and along York Road to
Handford's Line and along the said Line to where it first began to him and
his Heirs forever. But my Will and desire is that his Mother Eliz^a Hubbard
shall have Pleasurable Possession of the Plantation and Housing where she
now lives with Ground Fencing stuff and Firewood during her Life.

Item I give all the remaining part of my Land in Warwick County to my
Son William Handford and his Heirs forever excepting the Plantation

Item I give and bequeath to Matthew Hubbard One hundred acres of Land
more or less being part of the Land I bought of Robert and Litter Hubbard
in Warwick County and bounding as following Beginning at Hewitts
Corner Post, Then Northwardly to the Briery Swamp Thence South East
up the said Swamp or Branch to Warwick Road by the Poleys Pond Thence
North West along the said Road to York Road and along York Road to
Hansfords Line and along the said Line to where it first began to him and
his Heirs forever. But my Will and desire is that his Mother Eliza Hubbard
shall have Pleassable Possession of the Plantation and Housing where she
now lives with Ground Fencing stuff and Firewood during her Life.

Item I give all the remaining part of my Land in Warwick County to my
Son William Hansford and his Heirs forever excepting the Plantation
whereon Charles Miles now lives with the Housing Ground Fencing stuff and
Fire wood for the Plantations Uses I lend to my Daughter Ann Hansford during
her life or Marriage. And in case my said Son William should die without
Issue then I give to the said Matthew Hubbard and his Heirs the Plantation

and Land where Robert Hubbard now lives including a hundred Acres
more or less.

Item I give to my Son William my Negro Wench named Phillis.

Item I lend to my Daughter Ann the Use of my Negro Woman Jane
and her Increase from the Date of this my Will with her four Children

by Name Harry Cupid Chebe and Cuffy and likewise my two old

Negros Peter and Bep to her and her Heirs forever And my Will and

desire is that my said Daughter Ann shall have Authority Liberty and

Power to Sell Give or dispose bequeath or Will the abovesaid Negros to them
or they or whom she shall think fit forever.

Item I lend the Use of my Negro Wench Sibbey and her Child Bristol
to my three Grand Children by Name Susanna Harvey, William Harvey

and Rebecca Harvey to them and the Heirs of their Body forever

Item I lend the Use of my Negro Man Named Subbey to my Daughter
Elizabeth Collier during her Life and after her decease then the said Negro
to go to my Grand Daughter Rebecca Collier and her Heirs forever.

Item I give my Negro Wench named Lettice with her two Children Edmund
and Chloe of Negro Man Guy to Elizabeth Hubbard and her Heirs forever

Item I give to Mildred Hubbard two Young Cows.

Item I give to my Daughter Lydia Wagstaff twenty Shillings to buy her a Ring.

Item all the rest of my Estate not mentioned whatsoever and wheresoever together with my two Negro Servants Toby and Locust I give & bequeath

to be equally divided between my Son William and my Daughter Anne

Hansford whom I do constitute and Appoint to be whole and Sole Executor

and Executrix to This my last Will and Testament And as I am not in Debt

my desire is that my Estate shall not be appraised nor neither shall my

Executor and Executrix be obliged to give Security for the Probate of this

my last Will In Witness hereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal

Imprimis I give and bequeath to my three Sons Ambrose Thomas and Matthew Cobbs one Tract of Land in Henrico County lately purchased of Mr. Henry Cary which said Tract to be equally divided among my said three Sons but in case either of my three Sons should dye before lawfull Age or leave no Male Issue of their Body then to be divided among the Survivors of them.

2^d I give and bequeath to my Son Ambrose fifty Pounds Current Money to him and his Heirs.

3^d I give and bequeath to my Son Thomas Cobbs fifty Pounds Current Money to him and his Heirs.

4th I give and bequeath to my Son Matthew Cobbs fifty Pounds Current Money
