I John Jackson of the County of Virginia Planter being
at this present very weak in body & yet of good memory do make
this my last will & testament in manner & form
following I give and bequeath my Soul unto the hands of
almighty God who was the first Giver thereof and my body to the
earth from whence it came And all my worldly goods I do bequeath
in manner as hereafter followeth Vizt I give and bequeath unto my
wife Ann Jackson all the Ground within the House stand and
share with all the House thereunto belonging during her life and
likewise what I may as she shall have occasion to use to be taken out of
the whole without charge And likewise I give my wife Ann Jackson to
have my Son Thomas Jackson in her keeping & Custodie and under
her command until he shall be competent to work one year of
Age At which Age my S. Son Thomas Jackson shall have two slaves
by name Pat and Brown wth their families that shall infect themselves
with any venereal disease I do give to my S. Son Thomas
Jackson One Plantation which nowing to be belong to Joseph
Rogers after the death of the said Joseph Rogers desired That S. Thomas
shall have the said Plantation wth all the Land the he had within the House

in manner as hereafter followeth. I give and am bound to give
with I am to give all the Ground within the House stand on
shared with all the House thereunto belonging during her life and
likewise what ever as she shall have occasion to use to be taken out of
the whole or part of my said wife's share. I am to give and am to
have my son Thomas Jackson in her keeping & custody and to be
his guardian untill he shall be twenty years of age and of
age. All which I give my S. Son Thomas Jackson who have two sons
by name John and Thomas. I give female that shall inherit the said
after my death I have given and give to my S. Son Thomas
Jackson One Plantation which now is called belonging to Isaque
Rogers after the death of the S. I have devised the said Thomas
to have the said Plantation with all the Land the he has within the House
andly excepted which is for his Mother during her life. And if either
of the S. Sons be formentioned which I have bequeathed to my S. Son
should be mischanced or by misfortune do otherwise than well that
my S. wife Ann Jackson shall not be liable to make him good. And
moreover I do give & bequeath unto my S. wife Ann Jackson all the
rest of my Goods & Chattels with all moveables what so ever I have
during her life.

17 And after her death my Son Thomas Jackson to take
intended possession for himself and his heirs &c. to him and his heirs
for ever And fifty Acres of Land more which I have att York
where Land I do give to my wife to sell or dispose of for the
good of my Son till he come to Age for confirmation & truth
whereof I have hereunto set my hand this day & years abovesaid
