my body to be decently buried at the discretion of my Testator hereof
I command and for the better settling of disposing of my worldly estate
I do give & bequeath in manner following etc. I give and
bequeath to my friend Thomas Johnson of Beaver City County one
fifth part of all my & being in the said County he can
be my factor or any one of them the sum of Two hundred thousand
Dollars money. Then I give & bequeath all the remaining part of
my estate after my debts and credits being paid and discharged
both real & personal to be equally divided between my daughter
Martha Estman and my beloved children viz. Henry Coffey and

for Stark County Magistrate
I have had the privilege of examining
William H. Patterson, late a laborer,
and he left about three hours ago.
Last Friday he wrote and apprised me
of him and my friend Mr. Wm. D. Brewster
to be in labor of his wife, and I was informed that
she died. The said witness has no writing but what
this neighbour died of typhus and has not been buried
forty one days.
