and Ordain this my last will and Testament in manner as followeth. I
Commend my soul into the hands of Almighty God who gave it hoping
through the merits of my blessed Saviour to receive pardon & remission
of all my sins. Secondly I Commit my body to the Earth to be decently
interred according to the discretion of my Executors hereafter named and as
for my worldly Estate & it pleased God to endue me with I give and
bequeath as followeth. Item I give & bequeath unto my Son Samuel
Timfen all the furniture for Musfiring that was given to me by my father
Then my will & desire is that if my wife should be at this time with Child
as I believe she is and it should be a Son I give the Gun to him I had of
Mrs Creeper. Item and further my will is that if my wife should prove
with Child as I believe she is and it should be a Son I give my whole Tract
of Land lying in Blisland parish to him & his heirs for ever and if the
prove to be a Girl my will is that it may be equally divided between my
Daughters Elizabeth Timfen and the Child unborn to them & their heirs
for ever. Item I give & bequeath to my Son Samuel Timfen all the whole
Tract of Land named of Common Scarburgh to him and the Male heirs of
his body lawfully begotten for ever. Item Lastly my will is that after my
just debts & funeral Expenses be fully paid & satisfied the remaining part
of my Estate I give & bequeath unto my Son Samuel Timfen

of my Estate be equally divided between my Loving wife Sarah Timfen and
Children & that I now have and that I beleave her to be with Child with
and I do appoint my Loving wife Sarah Timfen and my Trusty friend
John Russell joint Exors of this my last will and
Testament revoking Disanulling and Making void all former wills
and Testaments by me heretofore made at writing my hand & Seal
