

In the name of God Amen I John Timpson of York County and the parish of Warton being sick in body but of sound and perfect Sense & Memory Thanks be to God for it do make Constitute and Ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner as followeth I Commend my soul into the hands of Almighty God who gave it hoping through the Merits of my blessed Saviour to receive pardon & remission of all my sins Secondly I Commit my body to the Earth to be decently interred according to the direction of my Doctors hereafter named and as for my worldly Estate w^{ch} it pleased God to endue me with I give and bequeath as followeth. Item I give & bequeath unto my Son Samuel Timpson all the Quantities for Mustering that was given to me by my father Item My Will & desire is that if my wife should be at this time with Child as I believe she is and it should be a Son I give the Gun to him I had of Mrs. Cooper. Item And further My Will is that if my wife should prove with Child as I believe she is and it should be a Son I give my whole Tract of Land lying in Blisland parish to him & his heirs for ever and if she prove to be a Girl My Will is that it may be equally divided between my Daughters Elizabeth Timpson and the Child unborn to them & their heirs for ever. Item I give & bequeath to my Son Samuel Timpson all the whole Tract of Land recover'd of Edmund Scarborough to him and the Male heirs of his body Lawfully begotten forever Item Lastly my Will is that after my just debts & funeral Expenses be fully paid & satisfied the remaining part of my Estate be equally divided between my loving wife Sarah Timpson and Children w^{ch} that I now have and that I believe here to be with Child with and I do appoint my Loving wife Sarah Timpson and my Trusty friend John Russell jun^r of New Kent County Executors of this my last Will and Testament revoking Disanulling and Making void all former Wills and Testaments by me heretofore made as witness my hand & Seal this 3^d day of Feby 1741/2.
