Sign Seal Publish and Declare the above and within Writing to be his last Will and Testament that the said Testator was then of Sound and Disposing Memory and that they the said Robert Martindale John Gibbons and Patrick Matthews at the request of the said Testator and in his Presence subscribed their Names as Witnesses thereto And on the Motion of the said John Selby who made Oath according to Law the said Will was Ordered to be Recorded and Certificate granted him for obtaining a Probate thereof in due form. Reserving liberty to the other Executors Named in the said Will to join in the Probate thereof when they shall think fit.

of October Anno Dom: 1740 And in the thirteenth Year of the Reign of
his Majesty King George the Second over Great Britain &c.
