I give & bequeath unto my Grandson Edward Ripping Tarpley the plantation or Tract of Land I purchased of M^r Henry lying in New Kent County to him & his heirs for ever Item I give unto my said Grandson all the Cattle horses & hogs on the said plantation belonging to me Item I give unto my said Grandson the following Household furniture now at the said plantation Viz^t 1 Looking Glass Six Chairs two Beds & furniture and two Oval Tables Item I give unto my said Grandson the follow^g household furniture in my Dwelling house Viz^t Six Silver Spoons one doz. best Chairs, one of the best Beds & furniture Six pair Sheets of the best Sort two doz. hard M^ttle plates one new Copper Kettle Item I give unto my said Grandson the Six Slaves following Wm^o Harry York Dick Bob & Bep^t Item I give unto my Grandson James Tarpley two Slaves following George & Lucy wth all their acc^s

Item I give unto my Daughter Elizabeth Tarpley Sarah a Negro Slave. All the residue of my Estate I desire may be appraised & remain in the possession of my said Daughter and after payment of my Debts the Overplus to be equally divided between my said Daughter and her three Sons James Quintus & John as they attain the age of Twenty one years and if either of them die before they come to the age of Twenty one years his or their share or shares to be equally divided among the Survivors. It is my will & desire that the Land I purchased of William Booker be sold and the Money divided as above. It is my will & desire that if my Daughter Mary she shall immediately pay one fourth part of my appraised Estate Debts & funeral Charges deducted unto the Guardians of her said Son James Quintus & John Lastly I do constitute & appoint my said Daughter Elizabeth Tarpley and my Grandson Edward Tarpley Executors & Executors of this my last will & Testament In Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand & Seal the Twenty third day of August One thousand Seven hundred forty four.
