Quaching Sheets two Dishes & half a Doz plates one Iron pot and some of my wearing Apparell at the discretion of my Daughters I likewise give her a round Table Cloth six Coarse Napkins and two Towels I give my Grand Daughter Mary Selater my Silver Tankard when she comes of

The Age of twenty one years or is Marry'd but if she dyes before twenty one years or Marriage I give it to my Grandson William Selator and my desire is he have his fathers Picture now in my possession I give all my Cattle Sheep unto John Tabb only such as are marked for my Granddaughter Mary Brodie I give my loving Grand Daughters Mary Tabb & Mary Brodie all my Silver plate to be equally divided betwixt them and if either of them should dye before they come of age or Marry I give the said plate to the next Sister of theirs I likewise give my loving Grand Daughters Mary Tabb & Mary Brodie that some of forty pounds that was left to my disposal by my loving Husband James Selator at my Decease which sum of forty pounds will be equally divided betwixt them and shall arise out of the Estate left by my loving Husband to my disposal at my Decease But if my Grand Daughter Mary Tabb dyes before she comes of age or Marries then I will the said twenty pounds go to her Sister Elizabeth Tabb and if she dyes before she comes of age I give it to Rachel Tabb And if my Grand Daughter Mary Brodie dyes before she comes of age then I give the twenty pounds her parts of the forty to her Sister Martha Brodie and if she dyes before age to Sarah Brodie I give my loving Grandson Richard Selator one Negro boy named Bob to him and his heirs forever but if he dyes before he is of age of twenty one years and without lawfull Issue of his body then to his Brother William Melton Selator but if both dye before twenty one years of age or lawfull Issue of his body then return as my other Estate to be equally divided amongst the Children of John Tabb & John Brodie I give my loving Grand Daughter Mary Tabb two young Negroes named Frank & Phillis to her & her heirs forever but if she dyes before she come of age or Marry then my will is that my Grand Daughters Elizabeth Tabb & Rachel Tabb have to possess the said two Negroes for ever I give my loving Grand Daughter Mary Brodie one Negro boy named Charles w. I formerly gave her on Consideration of the fathers Care of my Family I likewise give my said Grand Daughter Mary Brodie one Negro Girl named Peggy to her & her heirs forever but if she dyes before she come of age or Marry then the said Negroes to go to my Grand Daughter Martha Brodie to her & her heirs forever I give my loving Grand Daughter Martha Brodie one Negro Girl named Rachel to her & her heirs forever if she dyes before age of then to Sarah Brodie All my other Estate I give to be equally divided amongst the Children of James Selator John Tabb & John Brodie to be all equally divided amongst each of them Children in equal parts to each Child And I do appoint John Tabb & John Brodie to be Executors of this my last will and Testament I Witness hereunto I have set my
