of James Galthorpe dec^d. Viz^t Beginning at a Gum standing on
the head of Cherry Gut then running a straight Line bearing South
Seventeen Degrees thirty Minutes West to the head of Bakers branch

house stands was called Bakers field and further he saith not

The Deposition of M^r. John Chapman Saith That James G.
Galthorpe told him that the branch w^{ch} is proved to be Bakers branch
was during his residence in the Oak field and deemed to be the dividing
branch between the two Brothers James and Elshange Galthorpe and
further he saith not.

The Deposition of Henry Freeman Saith That he was several
times informed by Benjamin Shepard who lived on the Land in dispute
that the branch w^{ch} we run the Line was called by the Name of
Bakers branch and that the said Shepard had often told him that
from Bakers branch to the head of Cherry Gut was the dividing
