In the Name of God Amen I Parker Selby in Worcester County near Snowhill in Maryland being sick in Body but in perfect Mind and Memory do make this my last Will and Testament in the following manner Viz^t

I Impremised I Give and bequeath unto my Eldest Son John Selby all that Land and Plantation whereon I now live containing seven hundred and fifty Acres to him his Heirs and Assigns forever

I Item I Give and bequeath unto my Sons William and James Selby all that Tract of Land lying in Accomack County Virginia containing five hundred Acres to the same more or less to be equally divided between them to them their Heirs and Assigns forever but Provided that my Son John Selby his Heir or Assigns should lay any Claim to this ^{said} Tract of Land in Accomack that then my Will is that my said Sons William and James Selby should inherit that said Land and Plantation which I had allotted to my Son John they their Heirs and Assigns forever.

I Item I Give and bequeath unto my Son Micajah Selby one hundred and sixty Acres ^{of Land} being part of a Tract called Caroganesick with all the Improvements thereon to him his Heirs and Assigns forever.

I Item I Give and bequeath unto my Sons Parker and Zadock Selby all the Land and Marshes lying on Indian Creek to be equally divided between them when arrived at that time to them their Heirs and Assigns forever as

also my Schooner now lying up on the stocks with all the Tackle and
furniture thereto belonging.

Item I Give and bequeath unto my Daughter Tabitha Bailey Selby one
Negro Girl called Rhodney.

Item I Give and bequeath my Still and a large Silver Tankard to be
equally divided among my three Sons Micajah Zadock and James.

Item I Give and bequeath unto my beloved Wife Mary Selby a Negro
Woman Named Tamar.

Item my desire is that all the rest of my Estate of what kind so ever be
equally divided betwixt my beloved Wife and all my said Children.

Item I Constitute and Appoint my beloved Wife Mary Selby my Sons
John and Parker Selby joint Executors of this my last Will and Testament.

At a Court held for York County in the Colony of Virginia on Monday the
16th Day of March 1746.

This Will was presented in Court by John Selby one of the Executors therein
Named and thereupon Robert Martindale John Gibbons and Patrick Matthews three
of the Witnesses to the said Will Personally appeared in Court and being first Sworn
on the Holy Evangelists of Almighty God severally deposed that they saw Parker
Selby dec^d. Sign Seal Publish and Declare the above and within Writing to be his
last Will and Testament that the said Testator was then of Sound and Disposing
Memory and that they the said Robert Martindale John Gibbons and Patrick
Matthews at the request of the said Testator and in his Presence subscribed their
Names as Witnesses thereto And on the Motion of the said John Selby who made
Oath according to Law the said Will was Ordered to be Recorded and Certificate
granted him for obtaining a Probate thereof in due form Reserving Liberty to the
other Executors Named in the said Will to join in the Probate thereof when they
shall think fit.
