At a Court held for York County the 18<sup>th</sup> Day of November 1745.

This Will was presented in Court by Jane Hubbard the Executrix therein Named and no Witnesses being subscribed to the same William Hubbard Personally appeared in Court and being first sworn declared That he found the said Will in the Desk of the Decedent where he had to the Deponent the same was laid and that he the very well acquainted with the Hand Writing of the Decedent and verily believed the said Will and the Name thereto subscribed to be all of the proper hand Writing of the said Decedent. Whereupon the said Will was Ordered to be Recorded And the said Executrix having made Oath <sup>according to Law.</sup> thereto Certificate was granted her for obtaining a Probate thereof in due form.
