 the County of York being of perfect mind and memory do make my
 last Will and Testament in the manner following First I Give and
 bequeath my loving Wife all my Personal Estate so long as she is a
 Widow excepting the back Room and Closet which I bequeath to my
 indulgent Mother during her life and a Negro Girl named Betty to wait

and attend her likewise sufficient Meat Drink and Cloaths for her
 and the Negro Betty as above mentioned so long as my indulgent
 Mother shall live But if my Wife Anne Crawley should
 marry all my Estate to be taken directly out of her Power and the
 Land as my Dwelling House is upon I give and bequeath to my son
 Finson and his Heirs lawfully begotten and if the said Finson (Crawley
 should die without Heirs the Plantations to be sold and equally
 divided between my three Daughters Jane Mary and Nancy likewise
I give and bequeath all my Negro Stock and Household furniture
 to be equally divided between my son Finson and my three Daughters
 Jane Mary and Nancy And I do Appoint William Graves of the said
 County to be my Executor and my beloved Wife Anne Crawley Executrix
 of this my last Will and Testament requesting them to pay all my just
 Debts and Funeral Charges In Witness whereof I have put my hand
 and Seal I also give and bequeath to Fleming Bates my one Horse he
 shall choose after my beloved Wife has made her Choice

At a Court held for York County the 17th day of December 1759.
This Will was proved according to Law by the Oath of Emanuel Saylor
and Edward Cummin the Witnesses thereto and Ordered to be recorded the
Executors therein named refused to take upon themselves the Executorship
and Anne the Widow and Relict of the decedent personally appeared
in Court and declared she would not accept the Legacy to her given
and renounced all benefit and advantage she might claim by the s^d
Will And on her Motion she having made Oath and together with
Henry Wetherburn and Nathaniel Crawley for her security
entered into and acknowledged Bond as the Law directs Certificate was
granted her for obtaining Letters of Adminⁿ on the Estate of the
Decedent with the said Will annexed in due form.
