 my last will & testament in writing & did thereto dispose of

For want of a will
as to me shall belong & appertain at the time of my death
I give the same as followeth & first Whereas I the said
John do hereby certify that out of being impotent make
last Will & Testament in writing & did thereby dispose of
estate as hereb^y may appear which I Will and all legall
things given I do hereby certify & disavow of
that I remaine for & as my last Will & Testament
I certify & Will it that my executor hereunder
named shall after my decease pay all such debts
sums of money as in consequence shall come all the time of
my decease out of my whole Estate Especially I desire that
he pay to my brother William Helgate of the City of London
the sum of three hundred pounds of Law full money of
England and to take up the obligation I stand bound to him for
payment thereof I give & bequeath to Thomas Howton
my son & heir now resident in Holland all my Plantation
lands & tenements which to me doth or shall appertain
I certify & bequeath to him and

estate as heretofore
there given I do hereby utterly Revoke & disallow of
that I remain for & as my last Will & Testament
I myself make & Will is that my Executors hereunder
named shall after my decease satisfy & pay all just debts &
sums of money as in Conference that are at the time of
my decease out of my whole Estate Especially I desire that
they pay to my brother William Folgate of the City of London
the sum of three hundred pounds of lawful money of
England and to discharge his obligation I stand bound to him
present friends of whom I give & bind all to Thomas Norton
his son & underhand now resident in Holland all my Plantation
interest & Trade money which to me doth or shall appertain
all the sum of my decease in Virginia aforesaid To have and
hold all and every the said Plantation Land to me & my
heirs from & after he shall attain the age of one and twenty
years for ever and in the me and mine my Executors shall

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I do hereby give and take the Rent, Issue & profit of the said
Plantation and Messuages & premises which during her natural
life and then to have and enjoy all my said Land, Messuages
Plantations & premises and all what to me shall or might belong
all the time of my voyage during the & Dear me of her life
and in case my said young Wife shall die and depart this present
life that the said Plantation Land and premises shall by virtue
of this my Will, Revert descend & come unto my said son and heir
Thomas Bruton & he shall at once and it to my Will and desire
and do hereby request that if my said wife, Patience should depart
this life that Thomas not attaining to the age of one & twenty
years the said and my said son should be a guardian for the said
said Thomas of his said land & premises until he should have
come of age & in the meantime the said Thomas should have
the said Land & premises and do hereby declare that all and every my
said Plantation, Messuages Land & premises aforesaid and by this Will
bequeathed to my said son and heir Thomas Bruton shall

beloved Mary Kaylor out of my land in Virginia aforesaid & the
wreath & good man's form to keep for one whole year together
with flower head of cattle & good commit unto her the I Mary Kaylor

I give and bequeath unto her the same to be divided by to her the
will is that my Executor hereafter named shall during
the term of her life or so long as she shall enjoy the profits
keep the same in sufficient Reparation & Commit unto her
will willfully thereupon the rest of my goods and Chattels
personall Estate as well as moveables as immovables things
things which shall to me appertain or belongs all the time
my care and my Debt paye and Lender all discharged I fully
wholly give and bequeath the same unto my Sayd to my wife
Sibilla whom I make & ordaine full sole Executrix of my last will
