

Robt. Roberts
In the Name of God Amen I Robert Roberts of York County do Ordain this
will. To be my last Will and Testament in manner and form as followeth Viz

I Imprimis I Give the Use of my whole Estate to my loving Wife Elizabeth
Roberts she providing for my two Children John and Elizabeth as far as the Profits
of my Estate will allow but in case she should Marry then to be absolutely ousted
and barred from any part of my Estate of any kind whatsoever.

Item I Give unto my Son John Roberts the use of all the Lands I now am possessed of
and also the Use of the Land lately bought of David Brookes to him and his Heirs
lawfully begotten but in case my said Son should not leave Issue as aforesaid then
my Will and Desire is that all my Lands be equally divided as to Quantity and as
to Quality between my two Daughters Mary Bryan and Elizabeth Roberts to
them and their Heirs forever.

Item I Give unto my Daughter Elizabeth the Use of my Negro Wench called Megg
together with her Increase during her Natural Life and to her Heirs lawfully begotten
if any such and in case of that failure then to be divided between my surviving
Children or their representatives forever and as to the residue of my Estate I Give
equally to be divided between my three Children Mary Bryan John Roberts and
Elizabeth Roberts or their representatives and Lastly I do Constitute and appoint

At a Court held for York County the 20th day of January 1751.
Lewis Burwell Gent. made Oath and returned into Court with
Them at Bar with his security as follows. Let Burwell and Mann Bryan
Certificate a grant of Law for obtaining Letters of Administration of the Estate
of the within named Robert Roberts of York County will. In his will he has
deceased and his estate is to be administered by the Executors therein named.

This Will was proved by the Oaths of Jacob Pate and Matthew Pate
Witnesses thereto and Ordered to be Recorded and on the Motion of Elizabeth
Roberts and William Bryan the Executors therein named who made Oath
thereto according to Law Certificate was granted them for obtaining a
Probat thereof in due form giving Security on which they together with
John Bryan and Mann Bryan their securities entered into and
Acknowledged Bond in the Penalty of five hundred Pounds for the said Ex^{rs}
their due Adminⁿ of the Estate of the said Decedent and performance of his Will.
