Water Mill and my Negro Man Named Sherry and my Negro Woman Slave to him
and his Heirs forever and all the remaining part of my Estate be it in what Nature
or kind soever I Give and bequeath unto my loving Brother Gerard Roberts and to his
disposing only my Will is that my Nephew Samuel Roberts have my Riding Horse and
my wearing Cloaths and my Troopers Arms and my Gun I do Appoint my loving
Brother Gerard Roberts my whole and sole Ex: of this my Last Will and Testament
In Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and fift my Seal this 10th day
of November in the Year of our Lord 1746.

I do hereby Promise and desire that John Clithrell should be satisfied for all trouble Debts Dues and Demands upon me in the time of my health and in sickness and desire that he should be satisfied for Funeral Charges if in case I should depart this life to a better I now having 2 Pistoles Cash - And I do hereby desire that the said John Clithrell should after he is paid his due that he should gather in all Debts due to me and that he would discharge all Debt that is against me by their proving their Account And if there is any Money left after a full Settlement I desire that five Pounds Sterling should be contrived to George Troutbeck in the County of Cumberland and that five Pounds Sterling should be contrived to James Ranson in London nigh Saint Andrews Church Holborn And the Silver Shoe Buckles and Kneb Buckles I do leave to Eleanor Hall and the rest to John Clithrell entirely Witness my hand and seal this the 23^d Day of April in the Year of our Lord One thousand seven hundred and forty six.
