In the Name of God Amen I Samuel Roberts being Sick and Weak but in Perfect Sense and Memory God be blest for it do make and Ordain this my last Will and Testament in form as followeth First I Give my Soul to God that gave it and my Body to have a Christian Burial at the discretion of my Ex^r: hereafter mentioned Item I Give & bequeath unto my Nephew Samuel Roberts Son of Gerrard Roberts my Water Mill and my Negro Man Named Cherry and my Negro Woman Jany to him and his Heirs forever and all the remaining part of my Estate be it in what Nature or kind soever I Give and bequeath unto my loving Brother Gerrard Roberts and to his disposing only my Will is that my Nephew Samuel Roberts have my Riding Horse and my wearing Cloaths and my Troopers Arms and my Gun I do Appoint my loving Brother Gerrard Roberts my whole and sole Ex^r: of this my last Will and Testament In Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and feet my Seal this 10th Day of November in the Year of our Lord 1746.

Cumberland and that five Pounds Sterling should be contrived to James -
Ransom in London nigh Saint Andrews Church Holborn And the Silver Shoe
Buckles and Knee Buckles I do leave to Eleanor Hall and the rest to
John Clithrell intirely Witnefs my hand and Seal this the 23^d Day of
April in the Year of our Lord One thousand seven hundred and forty six.
