Soul to Almighty God and my Body to be decently buried and what Estate it has
pleased God to give me I give and bequeath as followeth.

Imprimis I give and bequeath to my three Sons Ambrose Thomas and
Matthew Cobbs one Tract of Land in Henrico County lately purchased of
Mr. Henry Cary which said Tract to be equally divided among my said three
Sons but in case either of my three Sons should dye before Lawfull Age or
leave no Male Issue of their Body then to be divided among the Survivors
of them.

2^d I give and bequeath to my Son Ambrose fifty Pounds Current Money
to him and his Heirs.

3^d I give and bequeath to my Son Thomas Cobbs fifty Pounds Current Money
to him and his Heirs.

4th I give and bequeath to my Son Matthew Cobbs fifty Pounds Current Money
to him and his Heirs.

5th I give and bequeath to my Daughter Hannah Cobbs fifty Pounds Current
Money to be paid her at Lawful Age or Marriage to her and her Heirs.

6th In case any of my Children should dye before Lawful Age the Money
belonging to such Child to be equally divided between the Survivors.

7th I give and bequeath to my loving Wife Mary Cobbs the Plantation I now

5th I give and bequeath to my Daughter Hannah Cobbs fifty Pounds Current Money to be paid her at Lawful Age or Marriage to her and her Heirs.

6th In case any of my Children should dye before Lawful Age the Money ^{or} belonging to such Child to be equally divided between the Survivors.

7th I give and bequeath to my loving Wife Mary Cobbs the Plantation I now live on my Negroes and all the rest of my Estate of what kind soever she paying my Debts and the abovementioned Legacies and giving up her right of Dower to the Land in Henrico County.

Lastly I do appoint my loving Wife Mary Cobbs my Sole Executrix of this my last Will and Testament made this fifteenth day of June One thousand seven hundred and thirty six
