 Parish in the County York being of sound Mind & Memory Do make this my last  
 Will & Testament in manner & form following First I recommend my Soul to  
 God and my body to the Earth to be decently buried  
 hereafter named and in the which will I do bequeath  
 bequeath on me I desire  
 just debts be paid by  
 Martha Hawksin  
 said Martha and her  
 Hawksin my  
 for ever. I give  
 the life (only of my whole Estate  
 Elizabeth Hawksin during the time of her remaining my  
 Mary again after my death that then she have the life of  
 natural life she paying my Debts out of the profits of my Estate & of maintaining  
 my Children and further I do require that my said wife have liberty to sell some  
 of my Stock or House hold Goods to help pay my Debts (if my Estate be so filling) and  
 my will further is that at the time of my said wife's decease or death which  
 shall first happen then I give devise & bequeath unto my Son John Hawksin  
 my Negro Man Jimmy to him & his heirs forever Likewise I give & bequeath

after the Marriage or death of my said wife I unto my Daughter Martha Hawkes  
my Negro man named George to him & his heirs forever and lastly I give & bequeath  
all the rest of my whole Estate (after my said wife's Marriage or death which shall  
first happen) to be equally divided between my said two Daughters Martha and  
Hawkes to them & their heirs forever. Then I give unto my Nephew John  
son of 10<sup>th</sup> Young my suit of Cloath Close. Then I nominate & appoint my friend  
Mr. J. C. of Warwick County my Overseer Trustee & Executor of this my last will  
& Testament and do appoint him Guardian unto my said Son John until such time  
he attain unto the age of Twenty one year In witness whereof I have hereunto set  
my hand & affixed my Seal this eighth day of Decr. 1743.
