Wharton In the Name of God Amen I Thomas Wharton Apothecary of the City of
Wile - Williamstrough in Bruton Parish in the County of York Virginia being of Perfect
Sence and Sound Mind. Do make this my last Will and Testament.
Imprimis I recommend my Soul to the Mercy and favour of Almighty God in
full and certain expectation of redemption from the Merits of his Son Jesus Christ the
Saviour of all Mankind who put their trust and Confidence in him and my Body to the
Earth from whence it came to be Buried in a Private and Decent manner.
Item I Give unto Elizabeth Deprea my servant now living with me the Sum of
Thirty Pounds Sterling to be paid immediately after my decease if so much ready Money
remains in my House otherwise to be paid her out of the first Money which is raised from
my Estate.
Item I Give and bequeath unto Naomi Deprea Daughter of the aforesaid Elizabeth
Deprea all my Real and Personal Estate whatsoever and whereever it may be viz^t
One House and four Lots in the City of Williamstrough which I have lately purchased
of John Goulthard Sadler of Williamstrough aforesaid and all my Money due upon
Bonds and Notes of Hands and Book Debt all my Household furniture my Gold
Watch and Plate and two Negro Wenches one Named Grace the other Kate and all
my Cattle and all my other Effects whatsoever saving and Except that I Give bequeath
unto Doctor Mackenzie my Silver hilted sword my Drugs Medicines Mortars (and all
other Physical Utensils and all other Drugs and Medicines which I expect from England

that I do bequeath of And I desire that if my Executor shall think it advisable to sell and dispose of one or both of the Negroes which I have bequeathed to the aforesaid Naomi Deprea that the Money arising from the Sale of such Negro or Negroes may be apply'd to the Purchasing of others for the benefit and use of the said Naomi Deprea and whatsoever Coffee Tea Chocolate Wines and Sugar I do bequeath of I Give unto Elizabeth Deprea for the Use and benefit of her Daughter Naomi Deprea and likewise my desire and intention is that the said Elizabeth Deprea shall have (Provided her Daughter Die before the Age of twenty one Years or Marriage) the above-mentioned House and Lots together with all my Plate Household furniture two Negro Wenches and the Cattle I am possessed of at the time of my death and all the Money which she may have at her decease and my Gold Watch provided she has no Issue and Die before the Age of twenty one Years I Desire may go to my Brother Robert Wharton Esq. Alderman of the City of Durham in England and to the Heirs of his Body.

It is likewise my Will and Order that Thirty Pounds per annum Currency be paid unto Elizabeth Deprea for the maintenance Clothing and a virtuous Education of the said Infant Naomi Deprea but if any ill Usage or mismanagement should happen to the said Infant from her Mother Elizabeth Deprea then I would have the said Infant placed some where else at the Pleasure of my Executor.

I appoint my worthy and Valuable friend the Rev^d Mr. Thomas Dawson Executor of this my last Will and Testament and that he be allowed all Expenses whatsoever in the Management of the said Estate and to be Guardian to the said Naomi Deprea and Disburse other Money as he shall think most expedient for her service. Lastly I do Ordain this to be my last Will and Testament — revoking all former Wills by me made at any time whatsoever In Witness whereof I do hereunto set my hand and Seal the eleventh Day of May in the Year of our Lord 1745.

This Will was proved by the Oaths of William Buck & James Coch Witnesses thereto and Ordered to be Recorded and on the Motion of the Rev^d Mr. Thomas Dawson the Officer therein named who made Oath thereto according to Law Certificate was granted him for obtaining a Probate ^{thereof} in due form Giving Security. Whereupon he together with William Nimmo Gent. his Security entered into and Acknowledged Bond for his due Administration of the said Decedent's Estate and Performance of the Will.
