forever. Item I give and bequeath to my Brother Allen Chapman
all my Lands in York County to him and his Heirs forever my Mother
having the Use of it during her Widowhood. Item I give and bequeath
to my Brother John Chapman one Negro Girl named Sarah to him
and his Heirs forever I also give unto my said Brother John Chapman
all my wearing Apparell. Item I give to my good friend Mr. Seymour
Pouell one my Watch. Item I give to my Cousin Thomas Trotter
Ten Pounds. Item I give the remainder of my Estate to be equally

Powell I give my Watch. Item I give to my Cousin Thomas Trotter
Ten Counds. Item I give the remainder of my Estate to be equally
divided among my three Sisters Ann Chapman Elizabeth Chapman
and Mary Chapman and their Heirs forever. Lastly I do Appoint
my loving Mother Ann Chapman Executor and my loving Uncles
Hudson Allen and William Allen my whole and sole Ex^{rs} of this my
Last Will and Testament revoking all other Wills by me made. I
Acknowledging this to be my Last Will and Testament As Witnefs my
Hand and Seal this sixteenth day of April and in the Year of our Lord
Christ One thousand seven hundred and fifty one.
