Item I give & bequeath unto my Daughter Sarah West one Negro girl called Sad to her & her heirs for ever. Item I give & bequeath unto my Son W^m Davis West one Negro boy called Tim to him & his heirs for ever. Item I give & bequeath unto my Son W^m Davis West five pounds to him & his heirs for ever. Item I give & bequeath unto my will & desire is that all the remaining part of my Estate be equally divided between my before mentioned Children to them & their heirs forever And I do hereby nominate & appoint my Trusty friends John Crawley and James Barber sole & sole Executors to this my last will & Testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this fourteenth day of Sept: 1738.

 apply'd towards the Education and Maintenance of my said two children
 James & Jane Lastly I do appoint my loving wife Elizabeth Taylor
 Sole executrix of this my last Will & Testament and desire my good friends
 Mr. Richard Ambler and Mr. Robert Martindale with the Justices to
 oversee the faithful performance of this my will In witness whereof
