I Give and bequeath to my Nephew William Harvey and the Heirs
of his Body lawfully begotten that piece of Land lying in York County
supposed to contain seventy five Acres be the same more or less where
my Sister Lydia Wagstaff lately lived but my Will and desire is that John
Harvey the father of the said William shall have nothing at all to do with or
any manner of Interest in or to the said Land on any pretence whatsoever but that the
Rents or Profits of the said Land be and remain to the sole Use and behoof of the
said William Harvey till he shall come to lawful Age.

And for my Land lying ^{and being} in Warwick County my Will and desire is that there be an equal division made each Division taking or including the one the Plantation whereon Charles Mites now liveth the other the Plantation whereon Anthony Roberts now liveth and I do Give and bequeath that part or Division where Anthony Roberts liveth to Edward the Son of John Wagstaff my Nephew to him and his Heirs forever. The other part or Division where Charles Mites liveth I give and bequeath to Walter the Son of John Chapman and my Sister Ann to him and his Heirs forever and my Will and desire is that my Brother in Law John Chapman shall not clear any of the said Land or remove or Convey any fence Rails or other Timber off from the said Land during his said Sons Minority but that the said John have liberty of sufficient fencing in Timber for the Plantations use.

I lend to my Sister Elizabeth Buck during her Natural Life the Use and Service of my three Negroes Virg^t Lender Hannah and Grace (the said Hannah now in Possession of Elizabeth Mansford Widow of my brother John dec^d) and after the death of my said Sister Elizabeth Buck I give the said Negroes together with their Increase to Judith Collier the Daughter of my said Sister Elizabeth to her & her Heirs forever.

I lend to my Sister Ann Chapman the Use and Service of my Negro Woman Phillis during her Natural Life and after her decease I give the said Phillis to Walter the Son of my Sister Ann Chapman together with her Increase forever.

My Will and desire is that my Free Servants Locust and Juba be by my Brother in Law John Chapman let to the best advantage and that the Profits & monies arising go to pay my Just Debts and after my Just Debts are paid and fully satisfied my desire is that the said Chapman keep to his own proper share one half part of the Hire of the said Negroes the other half part to be paid to the said John Chapman.

nothing go to pay my just debts and after my just debts are paid and fully satisfied my desire is that the said Chapman keep to his own proper Year one half part of the Hire of the said Negroes the other half part of their Yearly Gains I desire he shall pay to William Harvey, Susanna Harvey and Rebecca Harvey Children of my Sister Rebecca decd.

I Give to my Nephew John Wagstaff my Watch & wearing Apparel of all sorts.

My Will and desire is that Matthew Hubbard have of my Estate Two Pistoles yearly for five years for his trouble of being my Executor.

And further It is my Will that my Household Goods of all sorts and my Stock of all kinds as Cattle Horses Sheep and Hogs be to the discretion of my Executors hereafter named. I do to pay my Just Debts.

Lastly I do Ordain, Constitute and Appoint my friends Charles Hamford Junr and Matthew Hubbard Executors of this my last Will and Testament.
