Item I Give unto Mr John Wormeley four hundred and thirty five
of Land lying in New Kent County which was devised to me
by my brother Nathaniel Tinsons last Will the said Wormeley paying
my Executors or Assigns the just Sum of three hundred and forty pounds
Current Money of Virginia and all Costs that shall arise or accrue by or
from a Suit which was commenced by the said Nathaniel Tinson against
the said John Wormeley he complying with those Articles I Give the
abovesaid four hundred and thirty five Acres of Land to him his Heirs and
Assigns.

Item my Will is that my loving Wife Elizabeth Tinson shall have
the Use of the overhalf of my whole Estate during her Natural Life —

and after her decease I Give the said Estate to my daughter Ann Tinson and
to the Heirs of her Body if lawfully begotten I likewise give the other half of my Estate to my aforesaid
daughter Ann, *Ann Tinson*

and after her decease I give the said Estate to my daughter Ann Finson and
to the Heirs of her Body if lawfully begotten I likewise give the other half of my Estate to my aforesaid
daughter Ann Finson ^{to her and her Heirs (that is)} if the said Ann Finson should live to have an
lawful Issue But and if she should dye under Age and without such Issue
before my Wife then my Will is that my Wife Elizabeth shall hold and
enjoy that other part of my Estate which I have given to my Daughter
during her Natural Life But and in my Daughter should dye without
such Issue before mentioned and after my Wifes death Then my Will is
that all my Estate that is then in being shall be equally divided among
John Finson Son of John Finson dec^d. Samuel and Mary Crawley Son &
Daughter of Nathaniel Crawley Jun^r. Jane and Mary Crawley
Daughters of Robert Crawley Jun^r and to their Heirs &c My Will is
that my Estate shall not be separated or parted during my Wifes Widowhood
and that she may have the Education and bringing up of my Daughter.
I do Appoint Robert Crawley Jun^r. Nathaniel Crawley & Fleming Bates
Executors to this my Last Will and Testament In Witness whereof I have
set my hand and affixed my Seal this thirtieth day of November 1756.
