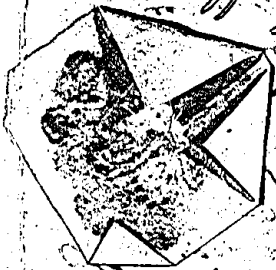

Virginia Test At a court held for the County of Harris, on
at the 19th day of June 1812. 5th year of the Commonwealth
Present John Commenswell, Peter Lynch, Daniel
Morris & John Reynolds, Gentlemen Justices. Before
the court appeared personally appeared David Harrison
and being duly sworn according to Law did on his oath
make the following declaration in order to obtain
the provisions of the late act of Congress entitled "an act to
provide for certain persons engaged in the land and
seaval service of the United States in the revolu-
tionary war" That he the said David Harrison
enlisted in the regular army of the United States in the
year in the State of Virginia in the Company Commanded
by Captain Stewart of the Regiment Commanded
by Col. Madsen for the period of one year that he
continued to serve in the said Company or in the service
of the United States until the period when the army was
discharged and he was discharged at Lancaster in the
State of Vermont that he served for the period of Eleven
months that he was at the battle of Cowas Hook & that
he is in reduced circumstances & needs the assistance
of his Country for support and that he has no other evidence
now in his power of his said service. Signed David Harrison

Appearing to the satisfaction of the Court that David
Harrison served in the Revolutionary war of the Common-
wealth and from the declaration here filed and the belief
in his truth from examination of the said David before
the Court and his standing and reputation in the County
ordered that the said Declaration be the opinion of
the Court be assigned to be the honest service of war
The Court being fully satisfied that the said David did
serve in the Army of the United States of the Common-
wealth more than nine months and is in reduced circumstances & needs the assistance
of his Country for support.

Sir:

I advise you that in the papers of the Revolutionary War pension claim, R. 4677, David Harrison stated that he enlisted in Virginia, date not given, and served eleven months in Captain Stewart's Company in Colonel Underworth's Virginia Regiment and that he was in the battle of Paulus Hook.

He applied for pension June 19, 1818, in Harrison County, Virginia. His claim was not allowed as he failed to furnish proof of service as required by the pension law.

There are no data relative to his family.
