On this the 12 day of March 1843 Personally appeared before me Joseph Munsatt an acting Justice of the Peace in and for the County of Marion State of Kentucky Mrs Francis Ann Ramsey a resident of the said County of Marion State of Kentucky aged upwards of eighty years and who is by reason of bodily infirmity prevented from appearing in Open Court, and who being first duly sworn according to law doth on her oath make the following Declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the Provision made by the act of Congress passed July 7th 1838 intitled "An act granting Raffle pay and Pensions to certain Indi- ws. that she is the widow of James Ramsey who was a Soldier of the Virginia Line during the Revolutionary War and served several Years in said war and for his service in said war he drew yearly a Pen- sion from the United States of Eighty Dollars per annum until his death which took place on the 16th day of June 1840: and for a detail of the character of the service of her said Husband in said war and the officers under whom it was performed and for such other particulars as are indispensable she refers to the evidence contained in the papers upon which her said Husband was allowed the Pen- sion of \$80 of eighty Dollars per annum which he continued to receive down until his death. She further declares that she has no documentary evi- dence in support of her claims except a leaf from her Bible and which was the Bible of her Husband and said leaf contains the birth of her said Husband and herself and of their children and also of two of their grand children the entries concerning the grand children are made on the latter end of the two columns of said leaf and all of the entries on said leaf are in the hand writing of her said Husband and said leaf is herewith filed. she further declares that she was married to the said James Ramsey more than a year before her oldest child was born and who was born on the 31st day of March 1786 as appears from the family record and which as of so is herewith filed and therefore she Declares that she was married to the said James

Ramsey in the latter part of the year seventeen hundred and eighty four that her husband the aforesaid James Ramsey died on the 15th day of June 1860 that she was not married to him prior to his leaving the service but the marriage took place previous to the first day of January 1794 or at the time above stated.

1832. Saith that he resided in Cumberland and Muhlen-
berg County Ky in the time of the War of 1812 that he
was an Ensign several terms of Continuation in said
Regiment all in case of marching and of short
duration probably not exceeding three or four weeks at a
time the last of which was at the Surrender of Lord Bern-
ier. That early in the year 1802 he enlisted for the
Period of three years in Edwards Corps and was
in the Company commanded by Capt J. Brown on
and known that he faithfully served in said
Corps until about 1803 when he was honorably dis-
charged at Little York Ga that he received a bid
Warrant from the State of Ga for 100 acres of land
where his discharge was out. He says that he never at
any time received one dollar of pay for all the service
rendered by him. That his bounty money is the only
money compensation ever received by him at any time
that he is not now on the American Roll of the U.S. or of
any ~~other~~ State and that he hereby relinquishes all claim
to a pension or annuity except the present and waives
and releases the day and year above —

Dear Sir:

Reference is made to your letter in which you request the Revolutionary War record of James Ramsey who served from Virginia, received a pension and who, you state, was a resident of Montgomery County, Kentucky.

You are furnished herein the record of the only James Ramsey, under any spelling, who served from Virginia, in which it is shown that he later moved to Kentucky. The data therein were obtained from the papers on file in the claims for pension and bounty land on file under W. 8341, based upon his service in the Revolutionary War.

James Ramsey (surname shown also as Ramsay) was born October 4, 1761. The place of birth of the soldier and names of his parents were not given.

During the Revolutionary War, James Ramsey resided in Cumberland and Buckingham Counties, Virginia. He enlisted and served several short tours as private in the Virginia militia; dates of service and names of officers not shown, but his militia service ended at the surrender of Cornwallis. He enlisted March 2, 1782, served as private in Captain Le Brun's company, Colonel Armand's Corps, and was discharged at "Little York" in November, 1783.

About March, 1827, the soldier moved from Buckingham County, Virginia, to Washington County, Kentucky.

On account of his service in the Revolutionary War, Warrant #1503, for one hundred acres of bounty land, was issued to James Ramsey April 23, 1829. He stated that he received from the State of Virginia one hundred acres of land, also, on account of his service.

James Ramsey was allowed pension on his application executed July 23, 1832, at which time he was a resident of Washington County, Kentucky. In 1837, he was living in Marion County, Kentucky, with

post office at Lebanon, Kentucky. He died in Marion County, June 16, 1840.

James Ramsey married late in 1784, place not stated, Frances Ann ___, who was born January 17, 1763; the place of her birth, maiden name or names of her parents were not stated.

Frances Ann Ramsey or Ramsay was allowed pension on account of the Revolutionary War service of her husband, James, on her application executed March 18, 1843, at which time she was a resident of Marion County, Kentucky.

If you desire information in regard to the location of the land granted James Ramsey, on account of his service, you should apply to the Commissioner of the General Land Office, Interior Department, this city, and furnish ~~the~~ official the number of the warrant, the acreage and date of issuance.

In order to obtain the date of last payment of pension, the name of person paid and possibly the date of death of soldier's widow, you should write to the Comptroller General, General Accounting Office, Records Division, this city, and cite the following data:
Frances Ann Ramsey, widow of James, certificate #1555, issued August 23, 1848, rate, \$83.33 per annum, commenced March 4, 1838, Act of February 2, 1848, Kentucky Agency.
