That he entered the service of

The State of Virginia under the following named Officer,

and served as herein stated: I was enrolled in the militia

in the County of Southampton at or about sixteenth

years old and was drafted into service the first time

that I was ever at which was in the date of 1777.

I went into service under Capt. Edmund Layton,

Daval, and Capt. Blunt, and marched through the County

of Gloucester & Newmore to Roads Mill & served six

weeks. I then served on Tawmudon Capt. Elias Morris

in the same Counties, I then served a term under Capt. M.

Edmon Bosley, and one under Capt. Robert and one

under Capt. Lewis, another under Capt. Philaborn

and once under Capt Myrick, and others that he cannot recollect, served under Major DeLamour late Post Master Col Gaskins and General Johnstonburg, I served at Petersburg city point across point, Cobbham at the Rocks on James River Smithfield, and at the defeat of Gen. Pickett's March 1865 hole ferry. I served on the north side of James River for the counties of Henrico, York, James City, and at Yorktown and Old James River one or two times under Gen. Lee three months, was never in any engagement, and have no living witness that recollects serving with him as he is

discharged from the service about four weeks before the British Army surrendered at Yorktown - he was discharged and released home to Southampton as to the different times when he entered the service the length of the tours of duty, a many of the officers names, the lapse of time, and the effect of old age it is impossible for him to recollect - he never had a written discharge as it was not customary for the British in those days to receive them - that he resided in the County of Southampton, and always entered the service from that County and was drafted into service, and he thinks and believes that he does not have served less than two years from the number of times he was called out to battle, that he has not document any evidence, nor is there any person now living that he can prove his services by

Dear Linda:

Reference is made to your letter in which you request the record of Jesse Council, of Southampton County, Virginia, a soldier of the Revolutionary War; also that of Robert Love, who resided in Knox County, Tennessee, after the Revolution and died there about 1839.

Revolutionary War data furnished by this office are obtained from claims made to the United States for pension and bounty land based upon military service of soldiers of that war.

With the data furnished by you it has not been possible to make a proper search of the records for Robert Love; as a means of identifying the particular record in which you are interested, should it be on file, in addition to the data furnished by you it is essential that you give the place of residence at time of enlistment, the state from which he served, approximate date of birth and the name of his widow. Upon receipt of this information, a further search of the records will be made in your behalf. You are furnished herein the history of Jesse Council, the only soldier of that name or similar spelling, found on the Revolutionary War records of this office, the data for which were obtained from the papers on file in his claim for pension, S.9191, based upon his military service in that war.

Jesse Council was born January 14, 1780, place not stated.

While residing in Southampton County, Virginia, he was enrolled in the militia of that county, and at his first muster in 1777, was called into service, and from that time until about two weeks before the surrender at Yorktown, he served at various times on short tours, about two years in all, as a private in the Virginia Troops under Captains Edmond, Elias Herring, Edmund Cosby, Boyd Lewis, Whitehead, Ivrick, Colonels Hunt, Book Wills and Gaskins.

Jesse Council was allowed pension on his application executed September 17, 1832, while residing in Southampton County, Virginia.

There are no data as to soldier's family in the papers in the pension claim.

In order to obtain the date of last payment of pension, the name and address of person paid and possibly the date of death of the Revolutionary War pensioner, Jesse Council (#9191), you should address the Comptroller General, General Accounting Office, Records Division, this city, citing the following data:

Jesse Council, Certificate No. 16365, issued August 2, 1832, rate \$28 per annum, commenced March 4, 1831, Act of June 7, 1832, Virginia Agency.
