Declaration

In order to obtain the benefit of the act of Congress of the 7th July, 1838
entitled "An act granting half pay and pensions to certain Widows"

State of Virginia
County of Giles

On the 25th day of August, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty five, personally appeared before the justices of the County Court for the County of Giles, Mary Waide, a resident of the County aforesaid aged 76 (near 80) years, who being first duly sworn, according to law, took on her oath, makes the following declaration, in order to obtain the benefit of the provision made by the act of Congress, passed July 7th 1838, entitled "An Act granting half pay and pensions to certain Widows" - That she is the Widow of Thomas Waide, who was a Soldier in the Revolutionary War - that according to the best of her knowledge and belief she testifies that he entered the service in the eastern part of the State (Virginia) served a portion of his time in the Militia (which his Colonel's name was Glades) that at one time he was commanded by Capt. John Weather of Winchester, Frederick County, Va. - that he also served a time in the regular Army - that he obtained his discharge but it was burned some years ago - when her dwelling house was destroyed by fire, destroying also the record of her marriage and her husband's death - that she knows of no way of proving his services unless from records in the War Department - that her husband had also two brothers (Joshua & Moses Waide) in the Revolutionary War, one of whom (Joshua) was as she thinks killed by the enemy at Point

She further declares that she was married to the said Thomas Waide at Winchester, Frederick County, Va. in the fall of the year 1789, or thereabouts, by the Rev. Mr. Bellomine, and that her husband the aforesaid Thomas Waide, died on the 1st day of September 1822; that she was not married to him prior to his leaving the service, but the marriage took place previous to the first day of January, seventeen hundred and ninety-four, at the time and place above stated.
