

On the 22 day of March 1853. Personally appeared before the undersigned an acting Justice of the Peace in and for the County and State above mentioned, Amey Covington aged 71 years a Resident of the County and State aforesaid who being first duly sworn according to law doth on his oath subscribe to the following Declaration, in order to obtain the benefit of the provisions made by the Act of Congress passed February 11 1853. Granting Pensions to Widows of Persons who served in the War of the Revolution. That she is the Widow of Robert Covington deceased who is the identical Person whose name was placed upon the Pension List of the Kentucky Pension Agency under the former Pension Act. She does not remember while he was a resident of the County of Madison and State of Kentucky an account of Services rendered by her said husband the late Robert Covington in the War of the Revolution at the rate of \$80. per annum if she remembers correctly as to the amount. Her mind being impaired from infirmities of old age. That said Husband Pension Certificate has long since been lost or misplaced so it cannot

be found also filed in the pension office at Louisville Ky
she further declares that she was married
to the said Robert ~~Boon~~ ^{Boon} in the County
of Madison and State of Kentucky on or
about the day of the year 1849
and that her name was Amy Boon before her
said marriage to the said husband, ~~and~~
that aforesaid Robert Boon died on the 10th day of
August 1849 in the County of Madison
State aforesaid that she was not married to
him prior to his leaving the service but the
marriage took place subsequent to the year
1800 - at the time above stated she further
declares she has remained a well and true
the death of her said husband, and that she
is now a widow and that she has never
before made any application for a pension
and to sustain her claim to a pension she
Respectfully refers the Department of the United
States at Washington City to the declaration of
her said husband and the proof therein filed
when upon his application for a Pension
and to the proof herein annexed

sealed with our seals and date this 27 day of February 1853.


The Condition of the above obligation is such, that where-
