Before me Robert A. R. Neal one
of the Judges of the Superior Court in & for said County,
Personally appeared Mrs Anna Wade a resident of said
County aged twenty eight years, who being first duly
sworn according to law doth on her oath make the
following declaration in order to obtain the benefit
of the Act of Congress passed July 7. 1838, entitled "An
act granting half pay and pensions to Certain widows"
that she is the widow of Joshua Wade dec^d of the County
of Bedford, and State of Virginia, who was a private
Soldier in the Revolutionary War, both in the regular
and militia service - that in the early part of the
Revolutionary War her husband the said Joshua Wade
Entered and served two years or more as a private
in the regular infantry service as a substitute (as she
is disposed to think) in the place of his brother Isaac
Wade who entered under Captain George Lambert of
the fourteenth Virginia Regiment who was Cashiered
and his men put under another Captain, and by
referring to the Certificate of James E. Heath of
Virginia the regular service of her husband Joshua
Wade may be ascertained (he may have entered in
his own place)

Her husband also

served three militia tours after he was in the regular
service, one of which was to the South in North and
South Carolina as far South as the Cheraw Hills in the
fall or winter of 1780 & 1781, ^{leaving three months on the occasion} he was also at the Battle
of Guilford in North Carolina in March 1781 and
York Town in the State of Virginia in Oct 1781 when
Cornwallis was taken, serving two months or more on
each of these last tours, all of which service she relates
upon information rec'd from her said husband Joshua
Wade and others.

And she further declares that she
was ~~not~~ married to the said Joshua Wade on the
second day of November 1786 in the County of Bedford
in the State of Virginia by the Rev. James Whitsett
that her husband the aforesaid Joshua Wade died
on or about the 15th day of February 1800 from an
injury rec'd from sliding on the ice, that a few years
after his death say in Novr 1802 or 3. declared and
removed to the State of Georgia and settled in
Elbert County, and has since moved to Franklin County
State of Georgia where she now resides - And she
further declares that she has remained a widow
ever since the death of her husband as aforesaid
to the present time, that her maiden name was Redright
that she was not married to her said husband Joshua
Wade ^{previous} ~~from~~ to this leaving the service of the United

States, but that the marriage took place prior to the first day of January 1894, (viz) at the time above mentioned as will more fully appear by the proof annexed to which she respectfully refers, both for proof of her marriage and of the service of her husband.

rding to law, doth on his oath say - That she is 77
years old; that she was well acquainted with Joshua
Wade - who married Anna Boatright - before he the
said Wade, went in to the service; during the Rev^os
war. she the deponent is very certain, that the
first service that the said Joshua Wade performed,
during the Rev^os war - was to the North, to take the
place of Isaac Wade, his brother, who enlisted under
Capt. George Lambert, to serve three years - and only
served one - the said Joshua Wade serving out the
balance of Isaac Wades time - and perhaps some
on his own account - deponent being about thir-
teen years old. at the time; which was in the
year 1777 or 78. That after the said Wade had
returned from said service and Lambert to the North,
he again went into service to the South, in comp^y
any with Robert Stevens - now port-master in New-
London - in the Fall of the year of 1780 - and
was gone from home through the winter, and
was at the Battle of Guilford, before he returned
and returned home in the spring of the year
1781. Deponent further says, that a few years after
the close of the Rev^os war, the said Wade was
married to Miss Anna Boatright in said County
by the Rev^d M^r Mitchell - deponent herself being
present at the wedding, and saw them married
with her own eyes - say in 1786. or 87. That about
the year 1798 - the said Wade was killed, by sliding
on the Ice, on a board; and that some
three or four years after his death, his

said County personally appeared Mr. Garnett
Lee a respectable resident of said County - who
being first duly sworn according to law,
doth on his oath say - That he is 63 years
old - and that about 50 years ^{ago} deponent became
acquainted with Joshua Wade, who was by rep-
utation a soldier in the Revolutionary war -
and his wife Anna, whose maiden name
was Boatright - and that they had 2 or 3 children.
That the said Joshua Wade and his present wife
did continue to live together as man and wife
until his death - which was in or about the
year 1798 - having come to his death, by sliding
on the Ice - he not living more than $3\frac{1}{4}$
a mile from dep. at the time he died. That
from the date of a lease of her land, now in
deponent's possession - the Anna Wade, the wid-
ow of Joshua Wade aforesaid, moved from the
County of Bedford to the State of Georgia, in
the Fall of the year 1802. But he dep. can't speak
of the County she moved to, from the letters he
has recd. which is dated from Franklin Co.
in the State of Georgia. That dep. has frequently
heard Wade speak of his services of the Rev^d war;
and tho, he can not recollect the character of the
service he performed, yet he is satisfied in his mind
that he Wade was in the service during the Rev^d war.

Frederick Green a Justice of the peace in
and for said County, personally appeared
Mr Robert Stevens a respectable Resident
of said County, who being first duly sworn
according to law, doth on his oath say -
That he is 90 years old that on the 5th
day of October 1779, he was called into service -
during the Revolutionary War - and marched from
the Town of N. London under the Command
of Lieutenant Irving, and Ensign Nance
in company of 18 men, including himself -
Joshua Wade, and Luke Valentine - a
free man of Colour - of whom service, the
same are Affidavit - some years ago, to
obtain a pension. That they were marched
to the South as far as the Cheraw hills
in South Carolina, their head quarters,
where deponent, Joshua Wade, and the
rest of Lieut. Irvine's Company, was placed
under the Command of Capt. Philip
Webber from Goochland County Va -
and Lieut. Irvine, - Ensign Nance
sent back home - because Capt. Webber's
Company had its complement of officers with
out them. That deponent, and said Wade
continued in said service together untill the
10th day of February 1781 - on which day they
returned home - and put in company at other
times in the County of Bedford. And
deponent does say positively, that Joshua
Wade aforesaid - who married Aricia
Boatright - did serve four 4 - months

with deponent as aforesaid, in the mili-
-tia, under Capt Philip Webber in the
Rev^d war. That some years after the close
of the Rev^d war, the said Wade was
married to Anna Boatright. and was
killed several years ^{after} his marriage by slid-
ing on the Ice: and that about the

for said County, personally appeared Mr John
Prebble, a respectable resident of said County
who being first duly sworn according to
Law, doth on his oath say - That he is 81
years old - That in the month of February
1781 deponent was called into service from the
County of (then) Bedford, under Capt. Helms
and arrived at Guilford N. Carolina in the
early part of March 1781 - and was attached
to Col. Lynch's Regt. Deponent recollects
very distinctly of seeing Joshua Wade (on said
occasion at Guilford Battle) who married
Anna Boatright - and became more
particularly acquainted with him - having
been only slightly acquainted with him before
he went into said service at Guilford.
That the said Joshua Wade, belonged to the
same ~~Regt~~ with deponent - Col. Lynch's -
but he Wade was in Callaway's Comp-
any - and dep. in Helms. Jacob Wade
the brother of Joshua Wade was also at the
Battle of Guilford. dep. saw them both from
time to time while in said service.

That the said Joshua Wade entered
for a three month term, as I learned
from him and others that belonged to
Capt Callaway's Company - deponent
saw only six weeks himself - and returned
home - but left Joshua Wade in the
service - he Wade did not serve less than
six weeks - he may have served three months
That a few years after the close of the Rev. War

the said Joshua Wade - as dep. understood - was
married to Anna Boatright. That several years
after he was married - he got killed from sliding
on the Ice: and several years after he died
his widow Anna removed from the County
of Madison - with her Father - to the State
of Georgia, as I understood.

stinctly seeing the said Wade at his Father's during
the Rev^o War, with Regular Uniform on, with U.
States Buttons - such Uniform as was then worn
by the Troops of the Continental Line. He said
Wade sung a song for Deps. at this, which
he learned when in the Army to the North - and
dep. is very confident from what he heard
the said Wade say, that he was in the Regular Ser-
vice to the North about the year 1778 - and that
at the time he saw him at his Father's - which
was toward the close of the war - he Wade had
not long returned from Service - dep. being then
a young man. Dep. was at neither the Cheraw
Hills, Guilford, or York; and therefore knows not
thing of Joshua Wade's Militia Services at those
places; but that he recollects hearing of Wade
having lost his shoes in the Swamp at the
Battle of Guilford. That about the year 1785-
86, or 87 - the said Wade was married to Anna
Boatright - and about 98, or 1799, was killed by sliding
on the Ice - and some years after removed to the
State of Georgia; as dep. understood. W. D. 11. 6. 11. 11. 11.

Terry a Justice of the peace in and for said county personally appeared Mr. James Echols, a respectable resident of the county of Campbell - who being first duly sworn according to law, doth on his oath say - That he is 76 years - that at the age of 12 or 13 years he then saw Mr. Echols, recollects distinctly of seeing Joshua Wade - who married Anna Boatright - with the uniform of a regular soldier on - such as was worn by the troops of the Continental line - at defendant's father's - he having not long returned from a tour of service in the regular services at the North - at least this is the impression of defendant at this time - Defendant cannot say, as to the precise year, that he saw Wade with regular uniform on - but that it was during, and between the beginning and the close of the Rev^d war - and that there is little doubt but that Wade served as a regular soldier at the North.

That a few years after the close of the Rev^d war, the said Wade was married to Anna Boatright - and that some years after his marriage - he was killed by sliding on the ice - and that a few years after his death, his widow removed to the State of Georgia.

On this 10th day of May 1842, before me, David Gibbs, a Justice of the Peace, in and for said County, personally appeared Mr. David Gibbs, a respectable Resident of said County, who being duly sworn according to Law, doth on his oath say - That he is 81 years old - that he was well acquainted with Joshua Wade - who married Miss Anna Boatright - before he went into the Service during the Revolutionary war. Dependant recollects distinctly, that Isaac Wade enlisted as a regular Soldier soldier, under Capt. George Lambert and was marched to the North, about the year 1777, and served out part of his time, and then got Joshua Wade - his brother - the above named to take his place as a substitute to serve out the balance of his time; this last he is fully satisfied of. Dependant also recollects distinctly, that in the Fall of the year of 1780, the said Joshua Wade, went again into the Service during the Revolutionary war - as a militia man, in company with Robert Hevens - now Post Master in Loudon Campbell County - and was marched to South; and was gone at least four months before he returned - which he thinks was in the month of February 1781 - for dependant was in Loudon, the day, that the said Isaac returned home from said term of Service. Dependant further recollects, that the said Joshua Wade did not remain but a few days, or a week or so at Quithart, before he again went into the Service as a substitute for his brother Isaac again - to go to the Battle of Guilford in North Carolina: dep. can not say precisely how long he Wade stayed on said occasion, but thinks it

was about two months - having returned some short
time after Mr Prebble died; dep thinks said Wade was
in Capt. Callanays company on said occasion. Depo-
nant also served a tour with said Joshua Wade in the
militia under Capt. Tho. Leitch and Lieut Ewing,
in the lower part of the state - in the Fall of the year
1781 - the Fall after the Battle of Guilford. The Regiment to
which deponent and Wade belonged to was stationed
at James Town on Pa. River - at the same time that
the troops under Washington, and Lafayette, had Lord
Cornwallis, hemmed in at Yorktown - which was
in October 1781 - deponent and said Wade served
about two months together, on said occasion -
the said Wade arriving at James Town after dep.
was there - and was attached to the same company
that deponent was - and was discharged some week
or ten days after the Surrender of Lord Cornwallis -
Wade must have left him about the first of Sept 1781 and
was discharged about the first of Nov. all returning home
to Bedford together, in Nov. 1781. That the said Wade
was married to Anna Boatright about five years after
the Battle at Yorktown, in the County of Bedford by the Rev.
Mr. Mitchell - dep. being at the Wedding. That some 10. or 12
years after his marriage, Wade was killed by sliding on the
Ice. That about the year 1802 his widow Anna rem-
oved to the State of Georgia, with her Father -
dep. having frequently heard from her since she moved
to said State.

Dear Madam:

Reference is made to your letter in which you request the Revolutionary War record of a soldier based upon whose service Anna Wade drew widow's pension, while a resident of Franklin County, Georgia.

The data which follow were obtained from papers on file in pension claim W.6388, based upon service in the Revolutionary War of Joshua Wade.

The date and place of birth of Joshua Wade and names of his parents are not shown.

While residing in Bedford County, Virginia, Joshua Wade enlisted about March 1777, with his brothers Isaac and Jacob Wade, served three years as private in Captains George Lambert's, Gross Scruggs' and Lewis' Virginia companies, was in the battles of Brandywine and Germantown; enlisted October 10, 1780, served four months as private in Captain Philip Webber's company; enlisted in March 1781, served two months in Captain Calloway's company, Colonel Lynch's Virginia regiment, was in the battle of Guilford, and enlisted in September 1781, served two months as private in Captain Thomas Leftwich's company and was at the surrender of Cornwallis. *In the Bat. of Guilford, he was serving in the 1st Co. of the 1st Regt. of the 1st Div. of the Continental Army.*

Joshua Wade died February 17, 1800, in Bedford County, Virginia.

Joshua Wade married November 2, 1786, in Bedford County, Virginia Anna Bostright, daughter of William Bostright. *Their union was recorded in the office of the county clerk of that county.*

In 1802 or 1803, the soldier's widow, Anna Wade moved with her father and family to Elbert County, Georgia, and later to Franklin County, Georgia.

Joshua Wade's widow, Anna, was allowed pension on her application executed July 19, 1842, at which time she was aged seventy-eight years and a resident of Franklin County, Georgia.

It is stated in 1842, that Joshua and Anna Wade had two or three children (the names are not shown). John B. and Polly Wade were residing in Franklin County, Georgia in 1842, and Polly was still a resident there in 1845. No relationship to the soldier was stated.
