State of Vermont } On the 6th day of February, 1821 personally
Washington } appeared in open court. Being a court of
of the State of Vermont holding a session at Montpelier within
and for the county of Washington, aforesaid Joshua Wade aged
fifty six years, resident in Berlin in said county who being duly
sworn according to law doth on his oath declare that he served in
the revolutionary war as follows: That on or about the 20th of March
1782 I enlisted a private in Capt David Tagles's Company and
Col Olney's Regiment of the Rhode Island line for the term
of nine months which term being completed I reenlisted for
the term of three years and at the close of the war I received a
discharge dated the 1st of March 1783 having served in all
seven months and eight days in Capt Tagles's Company and
Col Josiah Olney's Regiment in the Rhode Island line from
whom I received a discharge My original declaration is dated
the second day of April 1818 and my certificate issued and dated
October the 16th and numbered 3685. And I do solemnly swear
that I was a resident citizen of the United States on the 28th day
of March 1818 and that I have not since that time bought
sale or in any manner disposed of my property or any part the
with intent thereby so to diminish it as to bring my self
within the provisions of an act of Congress entitled an act to pro-
vide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service
of the United States in the revolutionary war passed on the 18th
of March 1818 and that I have not nor has any person on my
behalf any property or securities contracts or debts due
to me nor have I any income other than what is con-
tained in the Schedule hereto annexed and by me subscribed
to wit

I am by occupation a farmer, for seventeen years of my past life I have been much debilitated by the falling sickness, which together with the weight of fifty six years of poverty and hard fair has rendered me weak and feeble both in body and mind. I have no family connections from whom I can expect any assistance my children of whom I have seven are mostly for themselves two only are in a state of minority, and they are with their mother, who for the space of seven years without just cause has refused to live with me as a wife and they are all in low circumstances. I removed with my family from Durham lower Canada on the 7th of July following the declaration of the ^{late} war, at which place I had previously resided for about 20 years. I lost my farm and the most of my substance in Canada, because I could not consent to favour the cause of Great Britain. Two of my sons after we left Canada enlisted into the service of the United States one of which served during the late war and at present belongs to the five years at the Council Bluffs. My wife Mary is forty nine years old and is in tolerable health (and my children are generally so) who with part of her children reside at Richmond about 30 miles from ^{this} thirty acres of land as was mentioned in a former declaration of which I was possessed. I have been under the necessity of giving up because I was not able to pay for it. I owe about three or four dollars have nothing due to me except it be about five dollars with interest against a man in the State of Rhode Island given 21 years past. A fair bond against a man by the name of Joseph Davise of lower Canada for the due of a right of land given 24 years past. So Davise proved to be a bankrupt and in what part of the world he at present makes his residence is unknown. This I consider worth nothing.
