Sir

I am led to believe that from the "Washington papers" or from the State Department, sufficient evidence can be procured to prove the service of Thomas Made a soldier of the Revolutionary War. For these services, his widow, Mrs. Mary Made, claims a pension, and has filed an application therefor in your office. I have therefore

respectfully to request that you cause an examination to be made of those papers for that purpose.

Mrs. Made states in her declaration that her husband entered the service in the eastern part of the State of Virginia that he served a portion of his time in the militia. That his Colonel's name was Louisa - That at one time he was commander of a company of militia. That he was discharged from the service in 1783 and that he spent a considerable time in the army. I am assured that Lieut. John Smith is the person to whom she has applied

(Widow of a Revolutionary Soldier) do hereby constitute -
and appoint George W Phillips of the City of Washington
D.C. my true and lawful attorney for me and in
my name and on my behalf to prosecute against and
claim from the Government of the United States
whatever pension or arrears of pension that may
be due to me as the Widow of Thomas Waide
who was a Soldier in the Revolutionary War
and further to do and execute all and every other
lawful act or acts for recovering and obtaining the
claim against the United States as aforesaid (but
to my use, as fully and effectually to all intents
and purposes as if I were personally present
hereby ratifying and confirming whatsoever my
said attorney shall lawfully do or cause to be
done in or about the premises In Witness Whereof
I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my
Seal this 14th day of July 1845
