On this the 3rd day of January One Thousand eight hundred and forty three, personally appeared before me Clement W. Jordan a Justice of the Court of Pleas and Quarter Sessions in and for the County above named, Annex Trade a resident of said County aged ~~Seventy~~ ^{Twenty} years last February, who being first duly sworn according to Law, took on her oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the provisions made by the act of Congress passed July 7th 1838 entitled an act granting half pay and pensions to certain Widows. That she is the Widow of Robert Trade late of the County of Person and formerly of the County of Halifax Virginia (who removed from the County of Halifax to the County of Person after the War) who was a Lieutenant in the Army. She is in hopes to prove by the Testimony of one of the Soldiers who served with him; she is of opinion that he enlisted for the whole War and has often heard him say he left the Service without even getting the pay then due him or getting his discharge from the fact that he was off on a recruiting expedition. She thinks in North Carolina, when peace was made. She is unable to specify the particular service that her said husband rendered or any battles except the battle of Guilford; but the facts in relation to battles officers Commanding officers with many incidents all going to prove his service she will be able to establish by other testimony. She further declares that she was married to the said Robert Trade on the 1st day of September 1789; that her husband then a forlorn Robert Trade entered in October 1800; that she has not married to him prior to his leaving the Service but that the marriage took place previous to the first of January 1795; at the time above stated. Her said husband never drew a pension from the fact that he always said he had done nothing more for his Country than he ought to have done, and considered it a contradiction to demand it; but reverse of fortune has influenced this declarant to submit her just claims to the Department. She has made other attempts but those who had the matter in hand heretofore have failed to sufficiently investigate the subject to elicit the proper testimony and thus the declarant has been kept from that remuneration to which she thinks herself justly entitled according to the act of Congress in such cases made and provided. She further states upon her oath that her husband died leaving nine children; that she is now and ever has remained the Widow of her said husband Robert Trade.

This declarant further states upon her oath that from old age
and bodily infirmity she is not able to attend Court.

The claim of ~~John~~ Wade which has been before the department for a long time ought to be brought to an issue some way. Proof of service accompanied the declaration - Stating that Ro Wade enlisted for the whole war that he was an ensign - The time he served was not exactly established - James Brady says he heard him say he served from three to four years - Andrew Torgaw says he thinks two years - he saw him on his return from the army with his regimentals on No. 10. Now the precise length of service never can be established to us - it was from 1777 or to 1791 as many believe but if Sir Wade can do no better she will take the shortest time, two years.

D. Sir

I have the honor to inform you that your note of the 26th ult. addressed to the Hon R. M. Saunders of the Ho. of Representatives has been forwarded to me by that gentleman. And I regret to see that you are still hostile to the claims of Ann Wade. You say "The Supplemental ^{deposition} of Andrew Torgyan who can neither read nor write," "He meets in no respect whatever the objections which have been fully communicated to Mr Jordan who drew it". Now how you could find out that Mr Torgyan could "neither read nor write," I am at a loss to know. I was present when the Supplemental deposition was taken and recollect the question was asked him if he could sign his name and his reply was that his hand shook so badly that he could not write. But whether he can either "read or write," I am not able to say though I was raised in a few miles of him.

I would not unnecessarily urge this case, but it does appear to me that from the proofs adduced any jury would say the services were rendered, and she ought to receive her pension. In the first place John Fells proves that he was in the war with Rott Wade, in the second Mr White proves that he marched with him from Halifax Co. Va. to Hillsborough N.C. and in the 3^d Andrew Torgyan proves that they lived close together. I am never only depending them that Rott Wade enlisted (as he now believes under some of the Continental officers) was gone out of the neighborhood for sometime he believes at least two years that he saw him return with his regimentals still on that he as certainly served as any man that went from Halifax County. What plainer proof could a claimant at this remote period present than is here presented. In order that Mr Torgyan might well understand the deposition it was read over to him several times before he subscribed it. I hope you will sum up this testimony and again give it your serious attention and

inform me whether you intend to allow it or not. That I
may satisfy the widow whether she has any hope of relief
from you or not

said eight hundred and forty three, appeared before me
James L. Blackwell one of the justices of the peace in
and for the County above named, William White a res-
ident of said County aged Eighty Years, a Revolutionary
pensioner who being first duly sworn according to law
doth upon his oath state that he was acquainted with
Robert Wade late of the County of Person and State of North
Carolina who was a soldier of the Revolution and who
at the time of entering the service was a ~~resident~~ of this
County; That he was at the time a Lieutenant but in whose
Company he is not certain; That they met at Capt. Peter
Rogers in this County and marched from there to Hills-
borough in North Carolina; That in a day or two after
their arrival at Hillsborough, Robert Wade came to him
in the aforementioned town and told him farewell stating
that his Company had to march before him, the said White
would; but, that he supposed they would meet again before
they got home, he is of opinion that Wade's Company went
on towards Guilford Court house and the Company, to
which he the said White belonged, marched on as soon as
they got ready by Rugeley's Mills to Stone where they had a
battle. After the war had ended he states that he had
many Conversations with Robert Wade and always found his
narratives true in relation to circumstances and persons
correct. He and Robert Wade were raised in about twelve
miles of each other that they were acquainted from their
childhood that he knew said Wade to be a man of
veracity; he cannot say precisely the length of time he
served, but is of opinion that he served through most
of the War. He further states that the march from Rogers to
Hillsborough was as he thinks in the year seventeen
hundred and eighty or eighty one. William White

That the said Robert Wade was in service at the Battle of Guilford, of which he has a distinct recollection - that he is of opinion that he continued in the whole Campaign from the south, but has no distinct recollection of seeing him at any other place except perhaps, at Savannah - he cannot say who his Captain was but thinks it probable Capt Byron Wall was as they lived in the vicinity of each other, and he thinks that Col James Saunders was his Colonel. Of the fact of the service he is absolutely certain.

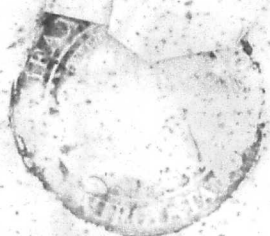
